be left out of consideration entirely since every motion that was put before the house was voted down by them. The instigators at last found that something was wrong and asked the freshmen what they wanted. They replied that they wanted representation and chose J. W. Litchfield, '85, who was made Treasurer, as their representative.

After the freshmen had been appealed the officers were chosen, H. Ward Leonard, '83, was made President of the Board of Directors, and Henry F. Ross, '82, was elected Secretary. The others on this Board were: Walter B. Snow, '82, H. B. Gale '83 and A. Stuart Pratt, '84. Arthur W. Walker was

chosen Editor-in-Chief with Arthur D. Little, '85, F. F. Johnson '84, G. W. Mansfield '82, and George J. Foran '83, as assistants. Harvey S. Chase '85, was editor of the Civil and Mechanical Engineering departments, Grenville Temple Snelling '82 of the department of Architecture. Charles H. Tompkins, Jr., '83, of Mining and Chemistry and R. Tilden Gibbons '83, was Sporting Editor. Samuel M. Munn '82, was made general advertising agent.

The paper as it first appeared in the form of a fortnightly periodical, being published every alternate Wednesday. The cover was a reddish-brown with a cover design by Geo. F. Shepley, '82, later of Shepley, Rutan, and Coolidge. Fifteen issues were published the first year, the first one appearing November 16, 1881, and the last May 31, 1882. From the editorial of this last issue, Volume One seems to have had a most successful year in every way. The Board had laid a firm foundation for all future volumes, had inspired the new men to take hold of The Tech and push it for all their worth during the next volume, and not only this, but had carried out the ideals they had set for themselves when The Tech was founded. To quote the editorial, "One of the aims of this year's management

has been to build a foundation for years to come,—a foundation worthy of this Institute, and one which should enable the paper to attain the greatest eminence in the future. Such has been our aim; and we rest assured that through the efforts of those who are to follow The Tech will establish for itself a name that shall not be forgotten." The way in which their anticipations have been carried out is evidenced by this thirty-sixth birthday.

The next year the work was taken up again with renewed vigor and was carried through with even more success than the previous year. That the paper was on a "firm financial basis" is evidenced by the fact that the following prizes were offered during this year:
