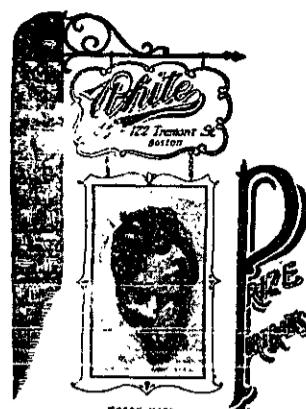

To the Editor of The Tech:
Dear Sir:

The five dollar and ten dollar subscriptions that are coming in begin to give evidence that Technology will do her share in raising the \$150,000 to be raised by the colleges of this country for the work of the Y. M. C. A. in the prison camps of Europe. The unanimity with which the men in the scattering groups already covered have been giving in smaller and larger amounts as they were able, is a further evidence that Technology spirit is real and that Technology men are humanitarians. Faculty subscriptions are coming in, an evidence that they are interested that Technology shall respond to this pressing need. I am confident that the results will make us proud of the Institute's body of students. Let us make this response to our fellow students unanimous. If we can't give dollars, let us give dimes, but let us give.

Two reasons should especially impel us to support this movement. First, that Technology as a unit shall do her share. No matter how much we have given to other things individually, let us collectively respond according to our ability, as other institutions have been doing. Second, it is the educated group that is suffering most in these prison camps. Those whose life has been one of mental activity, who are destined to sit for months dragging into years with nothing to occupy their minds but the brooding over their fate and that of their loved ones, are placed under a mental strain that is terrific and the number of those who go down under it is appalling. More important to these than even food and clothing, which they need greatly, is the need for reading matter, for school work, for organized activity for their own welfare and those around them. And the Y. M. C. A. is the only organization ministering to the needs of men in the prison camps. Through no fault of our own we are spared their fate. Shall we fail, out of our abundance, to minister to them in the hour of their darkest need? I think not.
