What is planned to be the biggest meeting of the Chemical Society this year will be held Friday evening, Jan. 12, at 7.30 o'clock in Room 2-190. This will be the last meeting before the new officers, whose names will be announced during the evening, take up their duties.

The speakers of the evening as arranged by Dr. Walker will be the directors of the five Course X-A stations. oarsmen when they start work on the river. Coach Stevens will be on hand during the winter to instruct the oarsmen, while Captain Deacon will also attend the practice sessions, and give instruction.

A block of lockers in the locker room in the basement of Building 1 have been reserved for the use of crew candidates, the numbers running from 1076 to 1145. Crew candidates may either exchange their own locker keys for keys to lockers in this group, or obtain new locker keys in this section, on application to Room 3-005. There are showers in this locker room and as the crew men will be expected to wear rowing trunks in the practice, it is essential that every man obtain one of the lockers reserved for the oarsmen.

More than 50 men reported for the fall practice of the crews and all of these are urged to report for practice during the next few days, and attend the meeting on Tuesday. Although there are but four machines in the basement of Building 1, a programme will be made out by which all of the candidates will be able to get in regular practice. Coach Stevens warns the men against starting with too rigorous training and has ordered all of the candidates to spend but a few minutes at the machines during the first week, lengthening the practice to about 15 minutes of hard work in the third week. This programme will put all of the oarsmen in good condition for the beginning of the regular work in February.

There will be an important meeting of all candidates for the Rifle Team this afternoon at 5 o'clock in the office of the Club in Room 1-075.

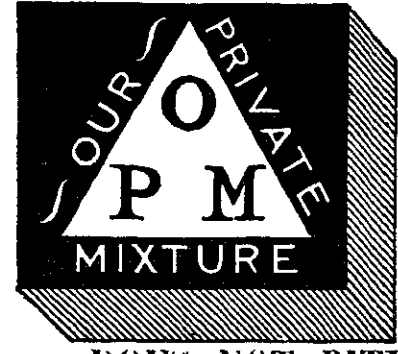
#### SOPH TECHNIQUE ELECTORS MEET THIS AFTERNOON

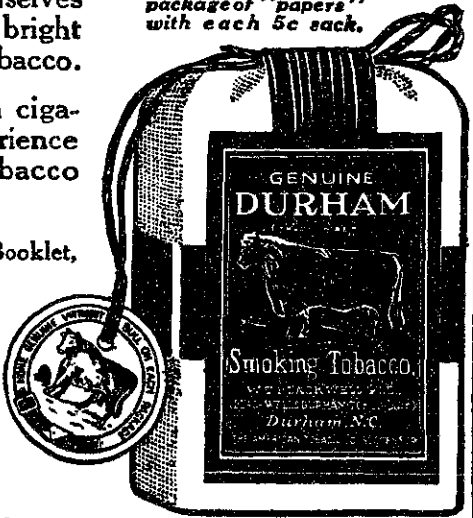
