Second Wrestling Team to Meet Andover Saturday

New Buildings Criticised

In an article appearing recently in the Boston Transcript, Huger Elliot, director of the department of design of the Museum of Fine Arts, criticizes the false artistic standards in such structures as the new Technology buildings.

Mr. Elliot made the criticism in a lecture delivered before the Business Woman's Club of Boston. "It is inexcusable," he said, "that Technology, which stands for structural truth throughout the country, should have false columns on its new buildings."

The Tremont Temple and a coal hoist in the rear of the city hospital also displeased Mr. Elliot. In these structures he found the Tremont Temple looking too much like a Greek Temple, and some arches used on the coal shaft "entirely out of place on a building used for such plebeian purposes."

expected of the assistants and the work of the entire department will be fully explained by him. One of the two freshmen selected to hold positions in the Stage Department will be automatically promoted to Assistant Stage Director of next year's Show if he proves capable, and in his Junior year he will hold the office of Stage Director. The second freshman appointed this season will become Sophomore Stage Manager next year, and in his third year will be made manager of his department.

The Stage Department of the Show takes charge of all the rehearsals, attends to the costuming of both the female and the male characters, and aids the coach during rehearsals.

The number of female characters in "Not a Chance" is greater than last year, and since most of the female talent at the Institute has been lost through graduation, men who think they may develop into actresses, or take female parts in the chorus, will have a good opportunity to make the cast or chorus.

The Boston performances of "Not a Chance" will be produced during Junior Week, which comes several weeks earlier this year than it did last, and therefore the actors in the Show will not have as much time to rehearse. It will therefore be necessary to begin rehearsing immediately, and the names of the candidates selected to play in the Show will probably be announced within two weeks.

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
