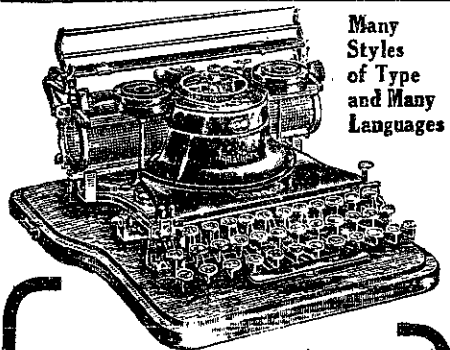

make up a successful man, not merely a successful engineer. He said that at best a college education was only a start, and that the principal thing which it accomplished was to teach a man to think. He advised the members to acquire a sense of humor if they did not already possess it, and above all to be optimists. He stated that the pessimist threw cold water on everything, and gave the best definition of a pessimist which he had heard—one who is seasick on the voyage of life. The absolute need of co-operation was impressed on the men, and finally Mr. Lee stated that the successful engineer was fond of his work and was always seeking opportunity to assume responsibility.

After his talk Mr. Lee answered numerous questions put to him by the members. One question brought out the fact that record of a man's work was kept by the annual efficiency reports, and that promotion involved a satisfactory report.

The next talk will be given Friday night, March 2, when Mr. E. J. Mehren will address the Society upon "The Work of a Publicity Engineer." Mr. Mehren is editor of the Engineering Record, and is Vice-president of the McGraw-Hill Publishing Company.

Other talks which have been tentatively arranged for by the C. E. Society are: "The Work of a Structural Engineer," by O. F. Hovey, Assistant Chief Engineer of the American Bridge Company; "The Work of a Hydraulic Engineer," by C. M.
