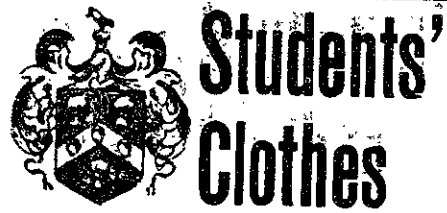

POSTER COMPETITION

Poster Design of V. Hafter Accepted by Show

The poster competition which Tech Show has been running has finally been decided. To Victor Hafter '17 was awarded the first prize, consisting of \$10. His work will be used on the score and program, while the poster winning second prize, designed by O. R. Freeman '16, will be used for the posters. Both of these men have been contestants for the poster competition for several years, Freeman winning it last year. The design of the winning poster is exceedingly clever and artistic, while its character has the properties of a good picture for the score and program covers. It was for this reason that the committee decided to use the winning poster for this rather than for use as a regular poster.

The pictures of all departments of the Show will be taken on next Sunday morning at the studio of Otto Sarony, 146 Tremont St. These pictures are to go in Technique and must be taken immediately. As the costumes are not yet ready, the pictures will be taken of the men in their street clothes. The cast, chorus, and ballet will have theirs taken at 9 A. M., the orchestra at 9.30, and the management at 10. Pictures will be taken promptly as scheduled and all men must report on time.
