 This afternoon at 4 o'clock in Room 4-370, Mr. Charles D. Hurrey will address the student body on "The Lure of the South." This talk is the next to the last one being given under the management of the T. C. A. on the general topic of engineering opportunities in foreign countries.
 This evening at 6 P. M., there will be a dinner given in the Caf under the auspices of the T. C. A. complimentary to all the men who have been teaching English to foreigners in factories about the Institute. The committee in charge wishes to state that other men who are interested in this sort of work are cordially invited to attend. Plates are fifty cents. The principal speaker is to be Mr. Fred H. Rindge, Jr., the Secretary of the Industrial Department of the Y. M. C. A. International Committee. The subject which will be discussed is the topic of teaching English to foreigners.


