M. I. T. A. A. PUBLISHERS ITS NEWLY ADOPTED CONSTITUTION

In order to put its newly adopted constitution into the hands of every Technology undergraduate, the M. I. T. A. A. has decided to have it published in The Tech. The first section of the constitution follows, and the remaining sections will be run in serial form in the following editions.

Article I.

Name:—Section 1. The name of this association shall be the Massachusetts Institute of Technology Athletic Association.

Object:—Section 2. The object of this association shall be to promote and supervise the athletic interests at the Mass. Inst. of Technology.

Article II.

Membership:—Section 1. The members of this association shall consist of the captains and managers of Institute teams, recognized by the A. A.

Section 2. The Faculty and Alumni shall be honorary members.

Section 3. The managers and captains of all class teams shall be members of the association during term of office, but without vote.

Article III.

Officers:—Section 1. The officers of the association shall be a President, who shall be elected from the Senior class, a Vice-President, a Treasurer, and a Secretary. The Treasurer of the Institute Committee shall be ex-officio the Treasurer of the association. The officers shall be elected by a majority vote of the association at the first regular meeting of the association in October and shall hold office for one year.

Article IV.

Election of managers:—Section 1. The managers and assistant managers of all Institute teams shall be elected by the association upon recommendation of the previous member.

Section 3. Representatives to the Inter-collegiate associations of which the M. I. T. A. A. is a member shall be elected by the M. I. T. A. A.

The undergraduate members of the Advisory Council shall be recommended to the Advisory Council for their election by the M. I. T. A. A. Two of the members shall be Seniors, and the third a Junior.

MAJOR ROCKWELL RETURNS

he took up medicine at Yale receiving his M.D. In the spring of last year he enlisted and was immediately commissioned at Camp Dix as major in the Medical corps. During the entire length of his service he has been medical chief of his unit, Base Hospital, No. 44.

Major Rockwell was reluctant to say anything of himself. While in France he met Technology men, three or four as patients in his own unit. The work of the Technology bureau in Paris was much praised by the doctor. "It is doing admirable work," he said. "I visited the union more than once and it seems to me that it is better than that of either Yale or Harvard. No pains are spared to give the fellows an enjoyable time. Gibbs is a host in himself."

Dr. Rockwell was much impressed by Field Day last Friday. He has reason to be proud of the occasion for Dr. Rockwell was instrumental in having clean, many athletic competition replace the old cane-rush. He could not find words to express his gratitude and appreciation for the reception given him by the students. "It was a most wonderful sensation to be so welcomed. It has made me ten years younger to witness such spirit as shown by them." Continuing on the benefit derived from such events, the doctor said: "The sport of friendly competition with its reaction of physical well-being was the thing that carried the day in this war. The inclusion and sacrifice on the part of our men has astonished everybody. Our men exhibited such courage and enthusiasm that they often were caught in their own barrage. They did their job cheerfully and did it well. All this is due in part to the American spirit of competition. Field Day is a great factor in developing such spirit and initiative."

Doctor Rockwell ended his interesting account of his experience abroad by an expression of real admiration for our country. "There's no land like America!" he said. "It never seemed sweeter than when I began to see such evidence of loyalty, spirit, and devotion on the part of the entire nation."
