

BUTTLER WINS NEW ENGLAND AMATEUR WRESTLING TITLE

Last week at the Svea Club in Cambridge, five Technology men wrestled in the New England Amateur Amateur Championship bouts, with the result that one man won out in the finals, and two others got as far as the semi-finals before being eliminated. Geo. Buttler '22, was the man who received the championship for the coming year. When the preliminary bouts took place three out of the five men made falls.

Capt.-elect Wood made quick work of his man and won the support of the spectators by his speed and snappiness. Gordon '21 and Dateo '21 in like manner threw their opponents, but Barnard '22, after several minutes of good wrestling, was suddenly thrown by means of a tortuous arm-hold to which he was not accustomed.

Buttler drew a bye, placing him ahead with the other three Technology men. Unfortunately in the second drawing, Iqteo and Wood were matched against each other, thus making it impossible for both of the men to reach the semi-finals. When this bout started, it seemed for a moment that Dateo would soon be thrown, but he managed to wriggle out of one or two bad holds, and then both he and Wood remained on their feet for the remainder of the period, the bout going to Wood by decision. Gordon and Buttler each threw their respective opponents after exciting tussels, and then prepared for the semi-finals. In the semi-finals Wood was the first man to wrestle, and in spite of his clever work at the beginning of the period he was thrown. At the start it seemed as if he would be able to carry this man off his feet as he did in the first bout, but the tables turned gradually, due mostly to the fact that Wood was not in as good condition as formerly, and he went down for a fall in the first half of the period.

Buttler and Gordon were next. Buttler after a rather hard time in which he failed to execute his favorite rolling arm lock for a fall several times, finally threw his man by different tactics, and thus placed again. Gordon put up a very good opposition to the man with whom he was wrestling, but toward the last of the period allowed his opponent to obtain a little too much the advantage, and thus lost his bout by decision.

When the final bout occurred, it was apparent to all present that both Buttler and his opponent were in excellent condition and that the bout would be good, since Buttler's opponent had held the championship for the three preceding years in the one hundred and forty-five pound class. There was a good deal of parrying before the two men went down on the mat, and the Buttler immediately tried for his favorite hold. The other man, however, had either been posted or been observant himself, for he refused to take any chances in spite of the fact that Buttler time and again tried to make him fall into it. This was really he undoing of Buttler's man, nevertheless, since by his refusal to pounce upon Buttler when the latter repeatedly went to his hands and knees to lead him on, he lost favor with the judges, and finally it became perfectly apparent stalling. The two were not actually down on the mat more than two or three minutes during the entire bout of fifteen minutes, but there was keen competition, and everyone present enjoyed seeing the bout.

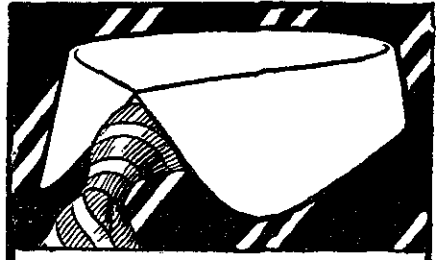

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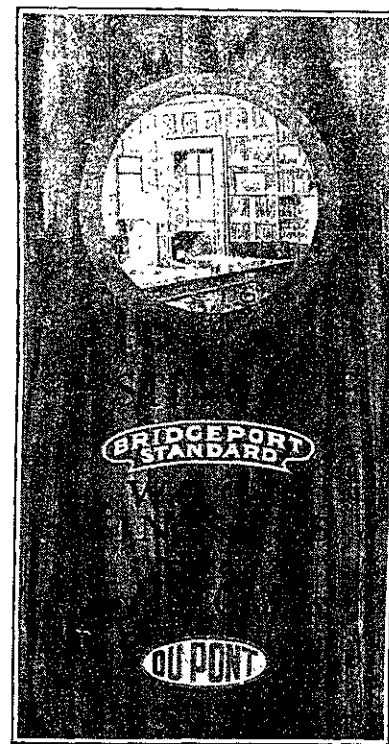
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
