ing maintained by means of a motor rheostat used in conjunction with an airspeed gauge.

In testing a complete model of a plane for "yaw" or rotation about its vertical axis in flight, or a wing for moment, the model is mounted on the channel arm in normal flying position and the moment of rotation determined by means of a calibrated torsion wire.

Wind tunnel tests with certain corrections are so remarkably accurate that the performance of a full-sized machine may be estimated to within five per cent. The Technology wind tunnel has been the chief source of research done along aerodynamic lines by the United States Government during the war, and this work is still going on.

**REGULAR CHEMICAL COURSES TO BE HELD DURING SUMMER**

The usual course in Qualitative Analysis will be held this summer, starting June 23rd and lasting for the regular six weeks. The number of students taking the course is to be large, for about one hundred and thirty men are enrolled. Both laboratories, in rooms 2-210 and 2-310 are to be used, and the same staff of instructors will take charge.

While the course in Qualitative Analysis is going on, at the same time, a smaller class will be studying Quantitative Analysis. Fifty men are expected to make up this class, and take advantage of the chance to make up the laboratory work which they have missed recently. The explanation for the large number taking these summer courses is that the war and the consequently large number of junior freshmen and special students have made the courses even more necessary than before.

**BASEBALL FIELD**

One of the diamonds is to be situated near building 4 facing the track house, while the other is to be near the oval, facing the river. Each field is to have a backstop thirty feet in back of home plate. These are to be twenty-six feet wide by fifteen feet high. Although the cinders are pretty poor on a ball field they will have to be put up with for this year. Next year the Bursar expects that the cinders can be taken away and the fields seeded.

Mr. Joblin of Stone and Webster who has charge of the work estimates that the entire cost of cleaning up and smoothing off the ground and building the backstops will be about \$250. He hopes to have the backstops completed some time this week.
