The first book will appear at the top of the little round house of death. The first four and twentieth books will be photographed by President Maclaurin. The first four books will come in their regular order, but the twentieth book will come at any time between the fourth and its regular place.

Immediately following the rush, two lines will be formed, those holding the slabs won in the rush in the order of the numbers, followed by those who have redeemed their signups. In the other line will be those that have not redeemed their signups, but who may do so at this time. These later, however, are not guaranteed a book at this time. The surest way to get a book is to pay up before the rush in the main lobby. A table is placed there every noon, and a man is there to take the final payment of two dollars.

The photographic editor will be in the office at 5.00 on the Monday and Tuesday of the week following the rush in order to return the pictures used in the book to those who desire them.

The winners of the Statistics and Grinds contests will be announced immediately before the rush.

Signups are void seven days after the rush, and the books will be placed on general sale at this time. Due to the large waiting list, the price of these books will be increased over the regular \$2.75. Signups are redeemable now.

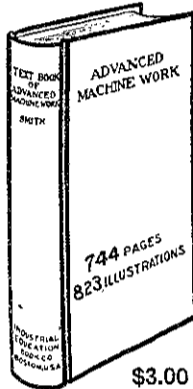
