The U. S. Artillery Journal is a semi-official periodical for artillerymen. It is published at Fortress Monroe, Va.

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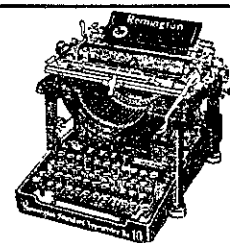
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
