The next speaker was Colonel Walker, who has just returned from Baltimore, after having been discharged from the army. His talk was based on personal experiences, and he started by saying that he wished it to be understood that he was not adversely criticizing the army in any way, but was only giving out some constructive knocking.

Major Wilson's subject was "Overload." He illustrated the principle in peace and in war, and pointed out the profits to be obtained by following it out. Through examples he pointed out the necessity of a protective tariff on chemicals. The danger to the Chemical Industry lies not only in German goods, but in other foreign made materials as well.

Major Hanson spoke on Gas Warfare in France. He reviewed the entire subject historically from the first chlorine attack of the Germans up to the time of the use of mustard gas. He explained the great success of the Germans in March, 1918, as due to the weakening effect on the English as a result of wearing the gas masks continually for five days.

Colonel Dewey made a few remarks at the end, citing a few personal experiences as Colonel Walker had done. After several more stories from many other members of the faculty who were present, the banquet ended, and closed a successful season for the Chemical Society.

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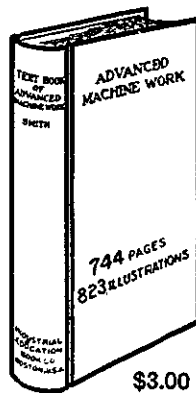
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
