**SHIPPING BOARD OFFERS
JOBS IN MERCHANT MARINE**

Henry Howard '89 of Brookline, national director of recruiting service for the United States Shipping Board, has announced that arrangements have been made by the Shipping Board to provide vacation jobs in the Merchant Marine for American college students.

Graduates of high schools and colleges are now permitted to take license examinations as third mates in the Merchant Marine after one year of sea service, and under a special ruling of the board this service may now be obtained, in the case of college men, before graduation, by going to sea four vacations of three months each.

Induction to sea-going must be on a training ship of the Shipping Board, where the collegian will rate for two months as an apprentice seaman, this service to be followed the first year by one month as ordinary seaman on a merchant vessel.

The second, third and fourth vacations will also be spent on merchant ships, though on varied voyages, as the board wants the college sailors to see as much of the world as possible during their training.

The collegians will also be encouraged to study foreign trade conditions, with a view to employment in the steamship business after they have mastered the principles of sea-going.
