place. Over 5,000 alumni were present from all over the globe, several coming from Australia, China and Chili, particularly for the occasion. The final event of the June, 1916, reunion was the dinner held simultaneously in thirty-five Technology centers throughout the country, each

diner in each city having a telephone receiver at his ear so that he might hear the speeches, no matter whether they were given in San Francisco, Boston or New Orleans. This entire demonstration was furnished through the courtesy of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Among the guests at the Boston section of this nation-wide dinner were Dr. Alexander G. Bell and Orville Wright. During the reunion

daily editions of THE TECH were issued—the paper at that time using the facilities of the Marconi Wireless Telegraph Company and the Trans-Continental Trunk Service of the American Telephone Telegraph Company. Both of these were given to THE TECH by the officials of the companies and no charge was made to the newspaper for this service which proved such a great asset.

When the Committee on the 1920 reunion announces its plans preparations will be made to produce similar issues on the part of THE TECH.


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
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
