INSTALL TRAINING TABLE FOR SQUAD

Runners May Combine with Crew in North Dining Hall—Triangular Meet Pending with Dartmouth and Columbia

WILL RUN HARVARD MAY 8

A decision has at last been reached concerning a training table for the Institute track team. A request for a training table was placed before the Advisory Council on Athletics following the inauguration of a rigid set of training rules before the close of school on March 21. The advisory Council agreed to the matter of having a training table and Manager Talcott started an investigation of the matter.

A quotation of prices from Walker was very high and Talcott saw the manager of Riverbank Court Hotel. His estimate was lower but lack of space forced him to reject the project. Mr. Worcester of the Council was appointed to see Bursar Ford to have the prices quoted by Mrs. Scriptures lowered if possible. His efforts must have brought results for it is now decided that a training table will be run in the North Hall of Walker.

Crew May Join Track Team

The candidates for the varsity and freshman teams will eat two meals daily at the training table. The number of men is still indefinite because it is quite likely that the crew will combine with the runners. Several track men have not been heard from by Coach Kanaly and consequently the size of the squad is not definitely known. Menus have been made out but no action can be taken till the size of the group is determined.

The M. I. T. A. has volunteered to make up any deficiency if the prices are too high for any of the men.

Will Meet Harvard May 8

The excellent weather combined with the newest of training rules and training table should help the track team considerably and Coach Kanaly is highly pleased with the increased chances of his charges.

A meet with Harvard has been scheduled for May 8 and negotiations with Cornell for a dual meet have proved unsuccessful because of the confliction of schedules and Technology's runners will not be seen in a meet with the Ithacans this year. A triangular meet with Columbia and Dartmouth is pending. If held it will be run in New York. The date is indefinite.

INSTITUTE MEDICAL WORK IS EFFICIENT

A pleasant man to meet, as well as an efficient man in his work, is Dr. J. A. Rockwell, medical advisor at Technology. He is to be found in his office room 8-101, any afternoon from 4:30 to 5:30 o'clock, attending to the minor ailments and complaints of the Institute students. As the work is too much to be handled by one man in an hour he is assisted by Dr. S. N. Vose. In the outer office Miss A. G. Riley, his secretary, obtains the necessary information for the card catalog from the men as they come in.

"Most of the troubles which come under my notice," explained Dr. Rockwell, "are slight sprains, wrenches, and bruises which the athletes bring in. The boxers and wrestlers are my most frequent visitors. Track events bring in a few number of men. Of course, colds and sore throats are also numerous in this kind of weather. While I should not like to make a statement that would deter men from taking part in the more strenuous forms of athletics, it is a fact that broken noses, and strains and sprains of various sorts are frequently brought in to me by the participants in the heavier sports.

Few Men Abuse Privilege

"One thing which I should like to emphasize," said Dr. Rockwell, "is that the men who come in to be treated are in no way obligated thereafter to have either Dr. Vose or myself in private work. Frequently a man will have some injury which will require a fresh dressing every day. As this office is not open on Saturday or Sunday, he must have the work done by someone else on those days. If he lives in or around Boston he will very probably get it done by his family physician. Otherwise, he is at liberty to choose any doctor he pleases and is in no way to feel that he is obliged to come to Dr. Vose or myself.

"It is strange how some men always abuse a privilege," continued the doctor. "There are a few at Technology, as there always are at any place, who come in frequently to see me, when there is really nothing the matter with them beyond what could be easily taken care of by themselves after I have once given them the advice. Some of these men who live in the
