
neighborhood are evidently trying to save on the bills of the family physician.

\$1 Per Year Per Man Is Cost

"We are usually kept very busy during our hour. One afternoon a short time ago there were twenty-five men in to see us, and we certainly had to hustle to get through with all of them."

This medical service at Technology is paid for out of the student tax. It comes to a dollar per year for every student at the Institute. Up to date, a little over a third of the number enrolled at the Institute, 1069 patients in all, have made use of the health insurance, some of them a number of times. The number of men treated monthly has increased rapidly during the time in which the plan has been in operation. During the year of 1912-13 only 275 patients were handled at the doctor's office. This number is only slightly larger than that cared for in a single month at present.
