**T. A. C. is Sponsor For Social Affair—Invites All Members of Competing Teams—Sell Tickets in Main Lobby**

**SETS NEW PRECEDENT**

For the first time in the history of the Institute, an entertainment will be provided for the competitors in the annual N. E. I. C. A. A. track and field meet which will be held on the Institute grounds tomorrow. The entertainment is in the nature of a tea dance in Walker Memorial from 5 o'clock until 9 o'clock in the evening. All men who compete in any of the events have been invited as guests of the Technology Athletic Club. All other members of the Institute may secure tickets for the dance at the table in main lobby.

This is the first social affair ever sponsored by the Technology Athletic Club and marks a new precedent in New England if not in the entire east. In the west this method of treating opposing teams has been in vogue for many years. If the dance is a success and is well supported by the undergraduates, the affair will in all probability become an annual event on the books of the T. A. C.

The price of the tickets to members of the T. A. C. is 50 cents while undergraduates who are not members can secure them at the same place for 75 cents. This price does not include the special supper which is to be served throughout the evening. The sale of the tickets is under the control of the investigating committee of the T. A. C. of which E. T. Steffian '22 is in charge.

Another feature of the entertainment will be the serving of the supper. If the weather permits, it will be served on the outdoor balconies instead of in the regular rooms of Walker.
