

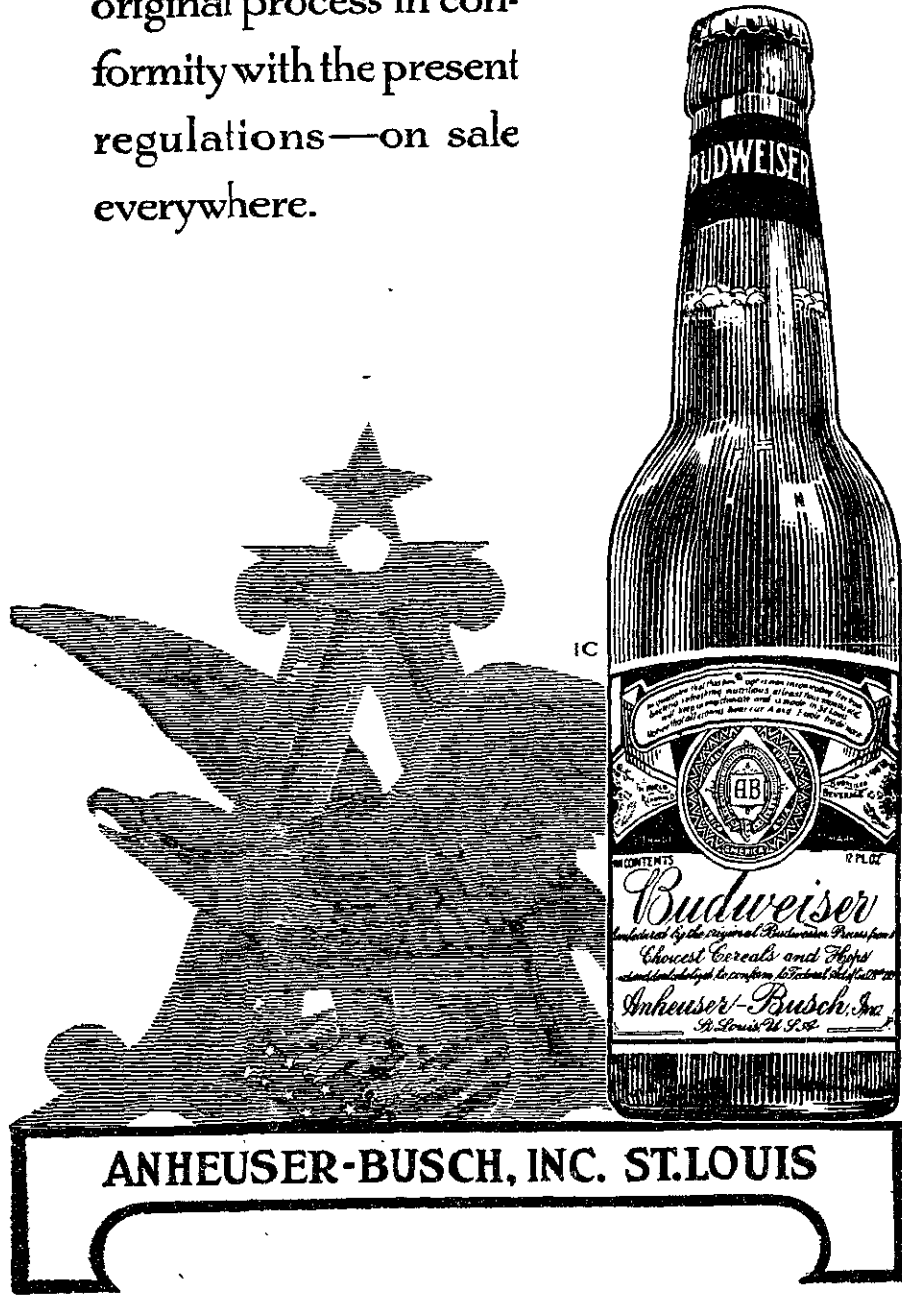
ELECT NEXT YEAR'S OFFICERS
