

**ALL DEPARTMENTS OF THE TECH MEET**

R. A. St. Laurent '21 and Managing Board Address Gathering—Every Department Explained in Detail

**MANY NEW MEN REPORT**

All the departments of THE TECH met in the library of Walker Memorial on Friday afternoon to hear what the department heads had to say and to get the men in the various departments acquainted. General Manager A. J. Browning '22 presided, while the speakers included R. A. St. Laurent, General Manager of Volume XL, and the present Managing Board.

St. Laurent stated that the Institute is looking more favorably on THE TECH and urged that the various departments of THE TECH work together. W. E. Purington '22 suggested that men with grievances report them to their department heads and talk them over rather than sulking over them. W. R. Murdoch '23 pointed out the possibilities for a man to get an idea of how real business is conducted from the experience he would gain in working for the advertising department. C. T. Jackson '21, treasurer, told what a man learns of methods of accounting from work for the treasury department which makes out the balance sheets for the paper. E. E. Kattwinkel spoke on the Circulation Department.

Stevens Bromley '23, news editor, brought out the possibilities of the News Department as a means of bringing men in contact with the big men around the Institute. He added that as a course in English Composition a few weeks in the News Department does more than a long term at the Institute English class.

After these speakers, every man out for the paper was given a chance to say something. Wayne McMeans '23, the Voo Doo correspondent, was well received when he said, "I have nothing to say". It was generally recognized that this was the shortest and most to the point speech of the afternoon.

It is planned that a smoker of THE TECH will be held at least once every month in order that the men may get together, meet each other and have good times. Other activities are also planned.

The competition now starting will last six weeks, at the end of which time, men will be elected to the various staffs.




