Saturday

9 o'clock—4 o'clock. Conferences 4 o'clock. General meeting for summarized report.

7 o'clock. Formal banquet in main hall, Walker Memorial. Provisions will be made for 190 men. Of these 50 will be Technology men chosen by the Committee for their prominence in the Institute activities. These representatives are to be grouped under four general heads, as follows: Student Governing Body, R. H. Smithwick in charge; Athletics, W. W. Russell in charge; Publications, A. J. Browning in charge; Musical Clubs and Dramatics, Stuart Nixon in charge. Leonard Metcalf '90, President of the Alumni Council, will preside as toastmaster. Business at this assembly will be transacted in Round-table fashion, such matters as future meetings and general topics being discussed.

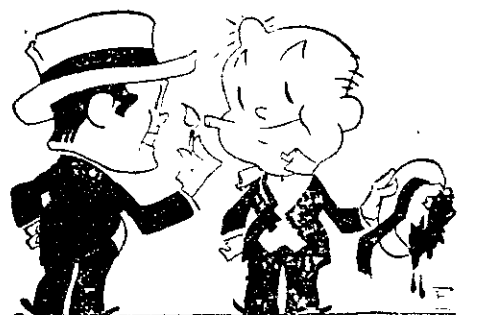
