

**ADVISORY COUNCIL HOLDS

Dr. Rowe is going to Philadelphia this week and he will have designs submitted by such prominent jewelers as Bailey, Banks, and Biddle, and Caldwell and Co. Dieges and Clust of Boston will also submit designs for the charms.

These designs will be submitted to a committee composed of Dr. Rowe, Major Briggs, C. H. Talcott '21, and W. S. Humphrey '21. The design will be selected next Wednesday, and will be of such a nature as to be suitable for either a charm or a pin.

Work will be started on the die immediately. The medals will be struck within four weeks and they should be ready for distribution about the middle of June or the first of July.
