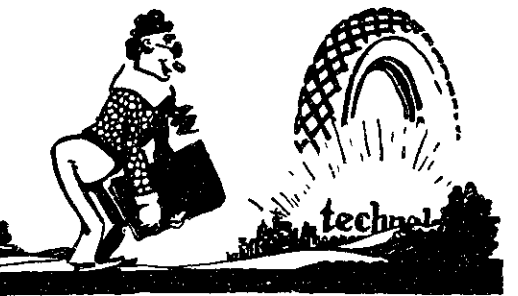

**STRONG DARTMOUTH TRACK TEAM OPPOSES INSTITUTE**

**Both Teams Good in Field**  
Both the Dartmouth and Technology teams are unusually strong in the field events this year. George Dandrow is undoubtedly the best hammer thrower in college circles today and, outside of this accomplishment, he is a reliable shot putter.

**Shot Put Doubtful**  
George Dandrow is the Beavers' best bet for a win in the shot put. While it is not his best event, still he can toss the weight a creditable distance and he will put in a strong bid for honors here. Dandrow was entered in this event at the Penn Games and succeeded in placing fourth in the intercollegiate championship.

Coach Kanaly, however, has several other good performers for this shot put who will probably gather in a few extra counters. In addition to Dandrow, he will enter George Boli, Rud Blatter, and John Kellar. Kellar had considerable experience with the weights last year and he is expected to do some creditable work tomorrow.

Dartmouth will enter their versatile athlete, John Shelburne, as their best man in tossing the shot. This Greater Boston boy stands as the Green's strongest sprinter in addition to being their lead in this event. The other men whom Hillman counts upon here are Lee and Turnbull.

**Dandrow to Meet Weld in Hammer**

Based on his performance this year, it is safe to say that George Dandrow will walk off with the 16-pound hammer throw. He has been doing especially good work all year and the fact that he beat the Tech field record in the event in the Inter-class meet with a toss of 156 feet was no streak of luck. He was entered in the 56-pound weights at Penn and captured the intercollegiate championship without much trouble. Howard, Dexter and Osborne are also slated to throw the weight.

Abe Weld will be Dartmouth's star performer when it is time to throw the hammer. He will probably give Dandrow the hardest competition he has seen yet this year. Weld took third in the 56-pound weight toss that Dandrow won at the Penn Relays last month.

**Tomson in High Jump**

Tommy Tomson, the crack hurdler, will also try the high jump. He is an expert at this branch also, having broken through for firsts here more than once. Among his other accomplishments, the Dartmouth star is a sprinter of no small ability but he will not try the dashes in this meet.

Technology has a group of good jumpers who will give the Green man some stiff competition. Greenough is probably the most capable of the lot but E. A. Merrill and Bill Pinkham are also worthy of notice.

**Beavers After Broad Jump**

Technology will make a strong bid for places in the broad jump. Carl Dipple of last year's team is a stellar

performer and Coach Kanaly looks to him for a first. Bill Pinkham and Ed Heap should add a few more points to the Institute's score in this event. Guy Pollard, Whittier, and Chun will wear the Green in this event.

**Pole Vault Looks Green**

Zack Jordan, of football fame, seems slated to run off with a first in the pole vault. He has been jumping for the past three years and should clear the bar at better than 12 feet. Dartmouth will also enter Sammis and Fisher in this event.

Coach Kanaly bases his hopes on Franny Walton, Morris Sheldon and Al Fletcher. Walton has been doing very well this spring and he is liable to figure in the scoring column.

**Meet Should be Fast**

The hurdle races, with Tomson entered for the Green, will be the most spectacular runs of the afternoon, and the big Canadian should show the spectators some remarkable traveling although he will not be pushed to his limit. The one and two mile grinds will probably bring out some keen competition and hair-raising finishes. As a whole, the meet should be fast and exciting from start to finish.

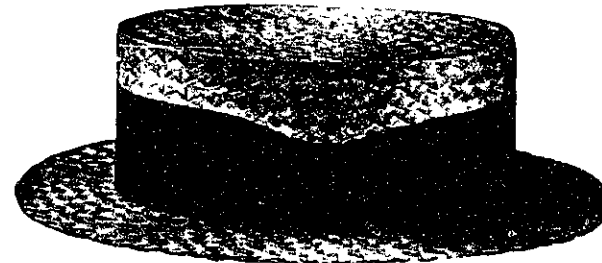
