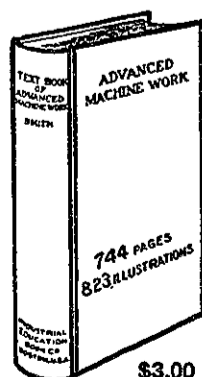

will be on hand to teach life saving and he will give the standard examination under Red Cross regulations to all expert swimmers who wish to qualify. The daily military calisthenics takes place on the beach in swimming suits and is followed by a plunge in the surf. Every student is urged to bring a bathing suit with him although suits may be bought at the camp store or in the adjacent towns. Many of the Washington summer resorts are near at hand, such as Buckroe Beach and Ocean View, and may be reached very easily.

**Dance Held Every Saturday**

Twice a week the students will be entertained by evening band concerts held in the Fort Monroe pavillion over the water. Movies are shown every evening in the Liberty Theatre at Fort Monroe and occasionally a vaudeville company is secured.

A students' dance is given at the Coast Artillery School every Saturday night. These dances are always well attended by the young ladies of the vicinity and the men will have plenty of partners for the functions. Evenings are entirely free and the students may leave the camp at noon Saturday and return Sunday night. Horses are available for the use of the students in addition to the required classes in horsemanship.

Students going to the Coast Artillery camp are advised to take all necessary toilet articles, towels, bathing suit, underwear, socks, tan shoes, and sneakers for use during calisthenics.

A notice has been posted on the military science bulletin board concerning transportation to the camp, and any additional information required may be obtained from Major Putney or Major Ottosen.

chen's head, stole third, and came in when Wheeler's single was muffed at third. Wheeler came in on Cook's hit, and Cook made home when Shorty Manning lost Carrier's single. Three runs as a result of one hit shows about the kind of support Kennett was given in the fourth. The Sophs were retired in their half of the fourth on a fly which was nabbed by Balcom, and a neat double play by Carrier and Peene.

**Sophs Practically Shut Out**

In the next three innings the only Sophs who wandered as far as the initial sack were Walt Kennett on a pass and Earle Bates on a single. The rest of the crew were snuffed out in short order by the excellent support given to Bill Wheeler by the men in the field. Walt Kenett was also given better support in the fifth, sixth, and seventh innings, and no runs were chalked up against him, the two hits which the frosh slid through being far enough apart to be not dangerous to the Sophs.

**Frosh Add Five In Eighth Inning**

In the eighth inning, Walt Kennett began to weaken, and five good hits, including three doubles, combined with two passes, served to bring home five more tallies to the frosh total. The fact that with a total of twelve runs, only ten legitimate hits were allowed by Walt Kennett, indicates the ragged support accorded him by the rest of the team. Seven hits were marked up against Bill Wheeler's the frosh hurler, and he struck out 5 as compared to Walt's 7, so the large margin held by the frosh can only be blamed on errors.

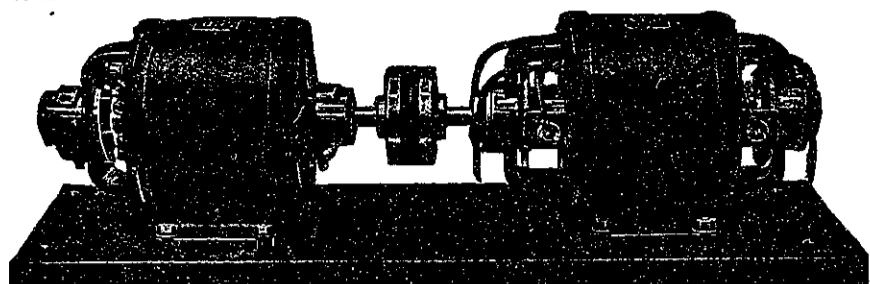

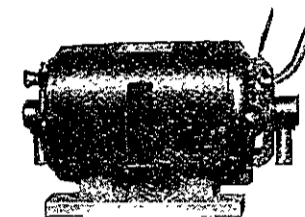
