LATIN-AMERICAN CLUB MEETING IS POSTPONED

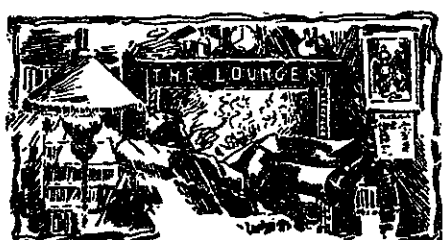
