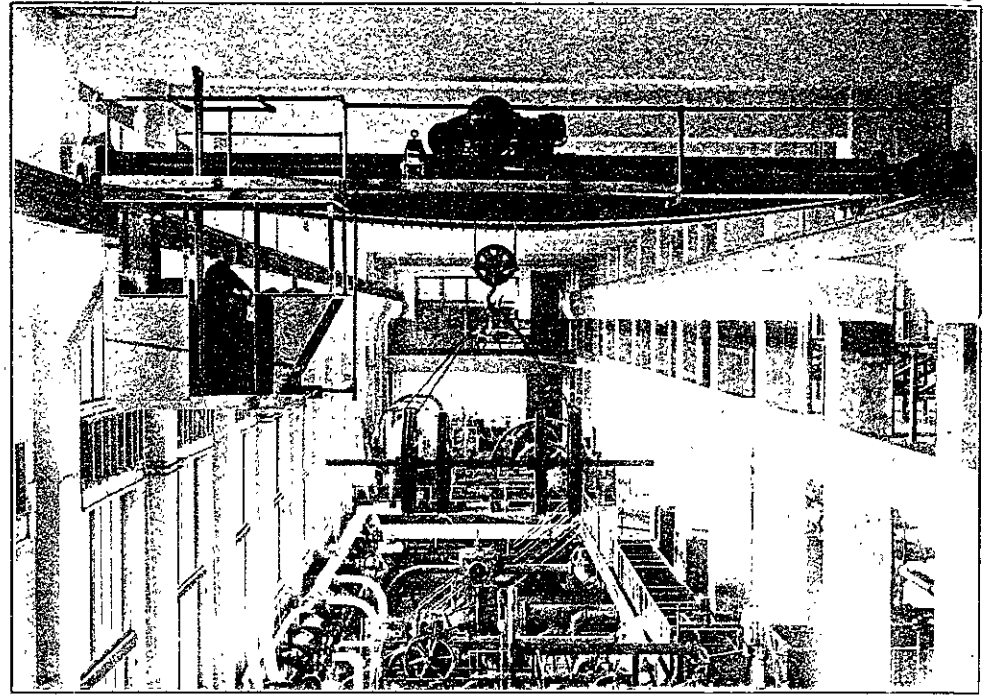


OLD MECHANICAL LABORATORY

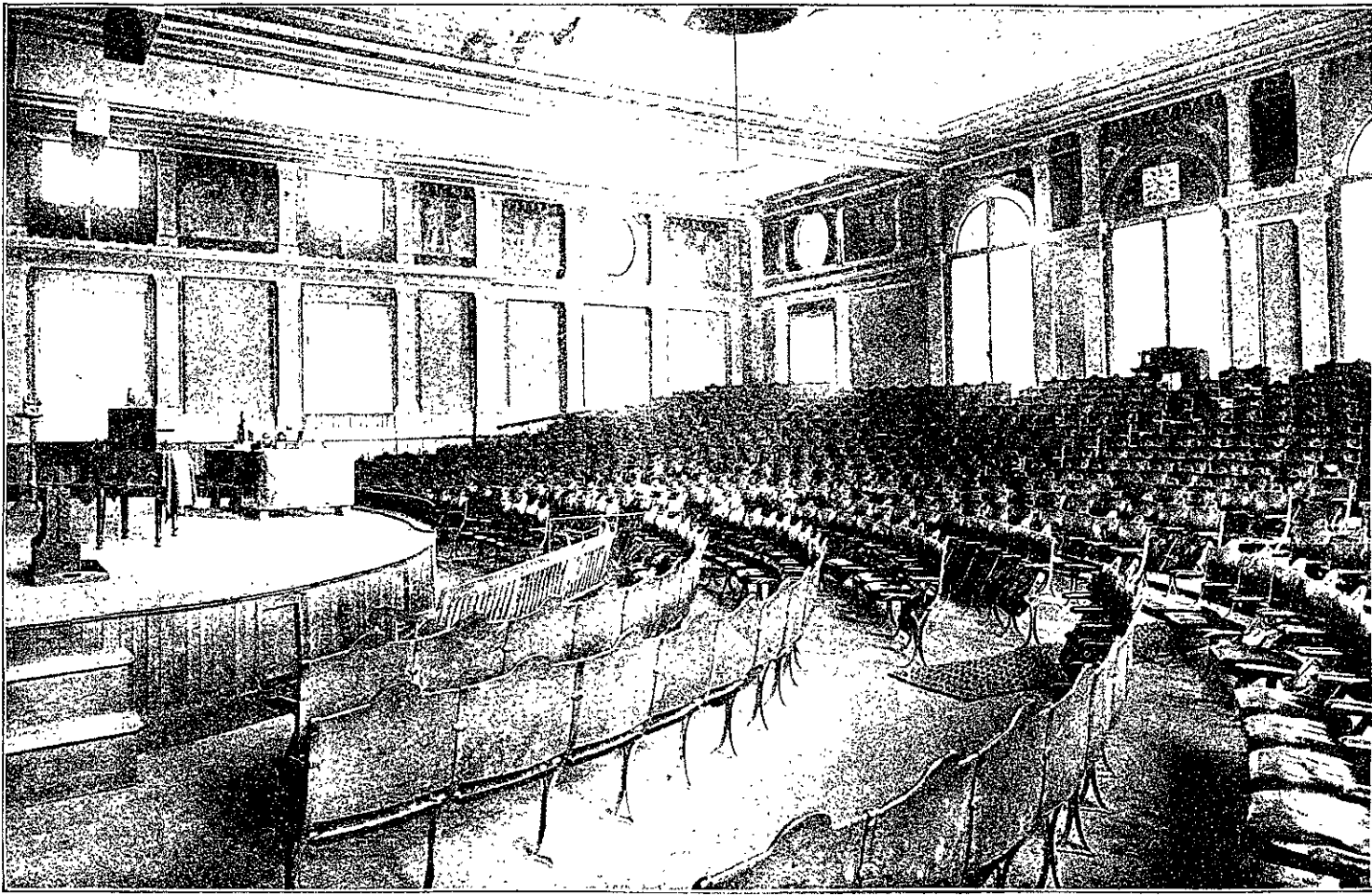
The laboratory was housed in Trinity Place. Though its size and equipment cannot be compared with the present laboratory, it was considered an excellent college laboratory.

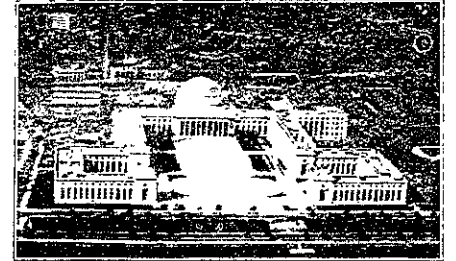
NEW MECHANICAL LABORATORY

A part of the present Mechanical Engineering Laboratory which is one of the best equipped and most efficient laboratories of its kind in the world.



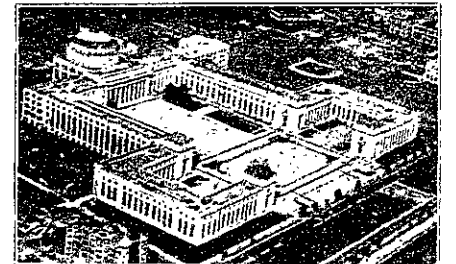
THE MAIN HALL OF ROGERS

Huntington Hall, which was the scene of mass meetings and student gatherings of the past. The old chairs and walls present an interesting comparison with 10-250 of today.

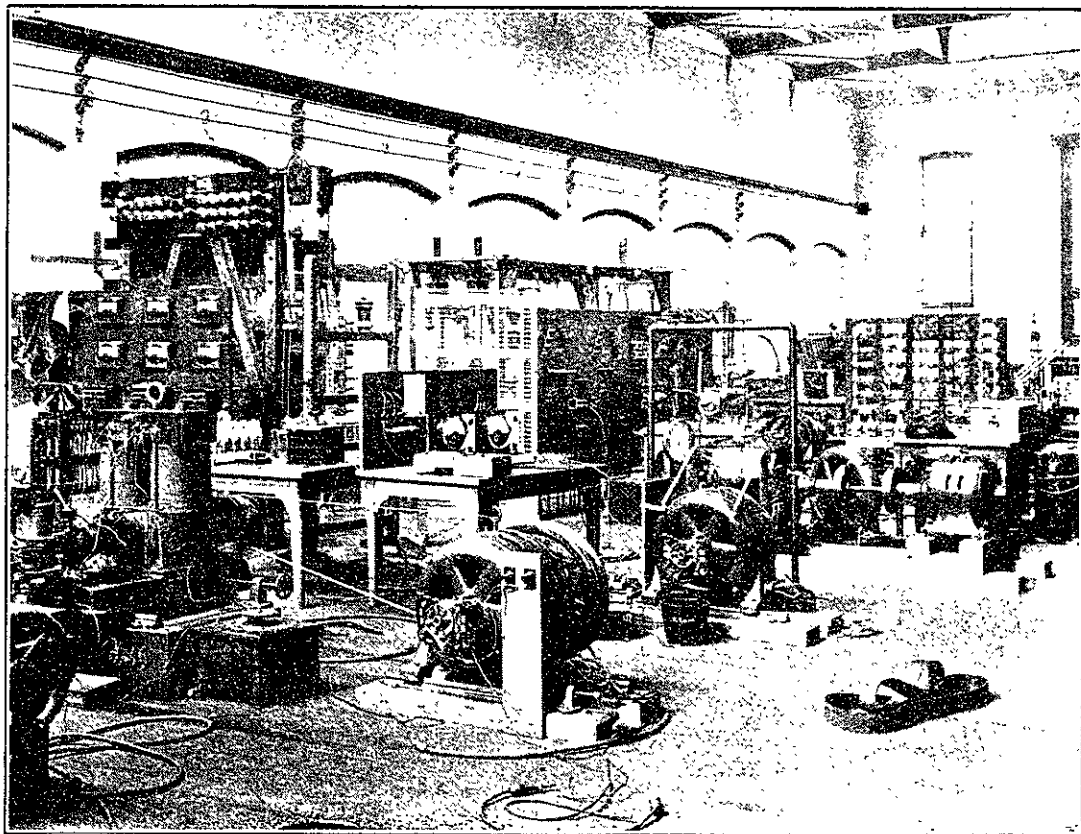

TWO VIEWS OF THE PRESENT BUILDINGS FROM THE AIR

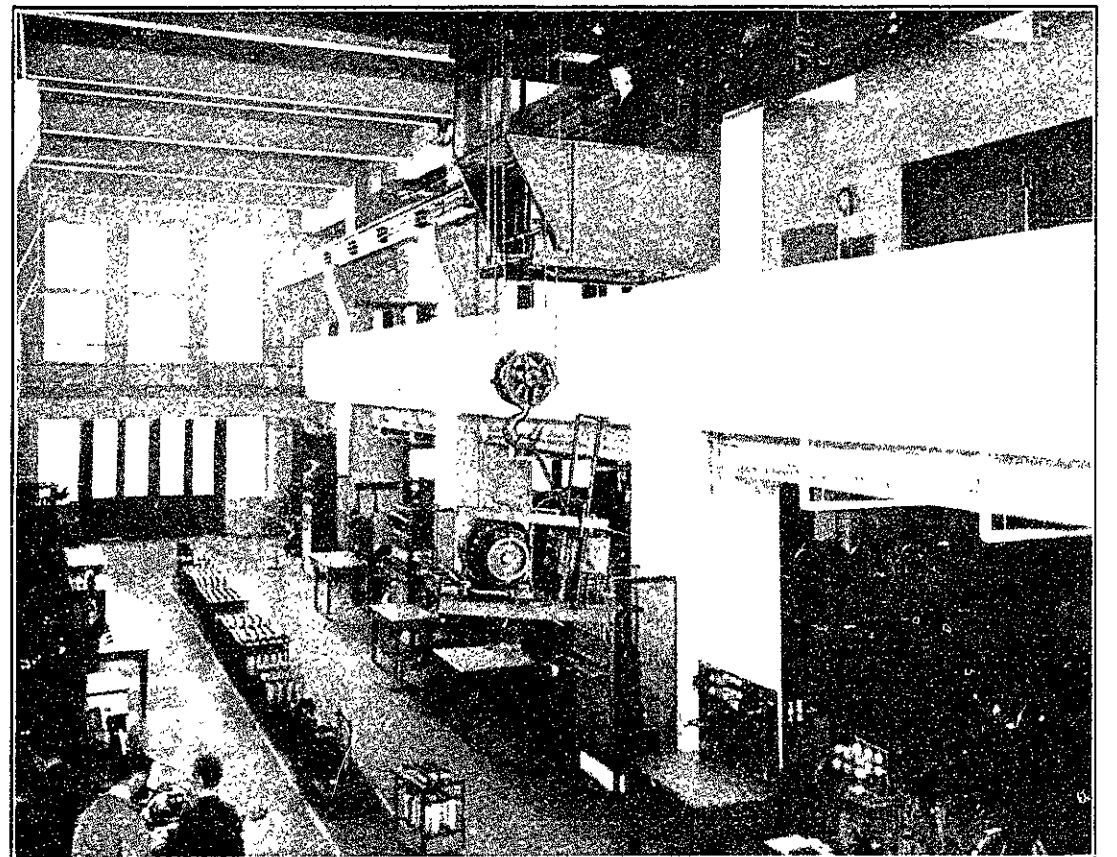
