125 Technology Oarsmen Attend Opening Meeting and Hear Plans

First Workouts Scheduled for Today—Varsity and 150 Pounders Get Busy

In response to the first call of the crew management for men a turnout of about 125 prospective oarsmen gathered in room 5-330 last Tuesday to get the first dope on early practice. Since then the staff has been busily deciphering the many schedule cards turned in and the first workouts are scheduled for today. Lists of the varsity and 150 pound candidates due to report this afternoon have been posted on the crew bulletin opposite the bursar's office.

Manager Fred Hungerford, after announcing the schedule as it now stands, introduced Dr. Allan W. Rowe '01. Being one of the foremost of those promoting crew at the Institute and a member of the Advisory Council on Athletics, Dr. Rowe is in a position to give the candidates a different side of rowing at Technology. He assured those present that the Alumni were back of them in every way. The appearance of much needed new equipment at the boathouse bears out his statement.

Crew Wants Heavy Men

Coach A. W. Stevens, an observer and a helper of Institute crews for many years, in speaking to the new men showed how imperative it is that there be heavy material from which to pick a winning crew. The mistake that many make in the way the power is applied in rowing he corrected, stressing the importance of a strong leg drive. He placed the lower limit of weight for the freshman at 140 pounds so that a heavier bunch might be picked.

Professor Fred Dellenbaugh has been doing quite a bit of work on crew statistics and gave a little idea of how big a part weight plays in rowing. One per cent better rowing, through weight or otherwise means a gain of a length a mile, according to his figures, and it takes a whole lot less than a length to win a race.

There is a possibility of an additional coach for the oarsmen this spring. Lieutenant Mason Harris, a graduate of Annapolis and at present a student at the Institute is to take the 150 pound crews if he can spare the time.

Training rules were passed out to everyone present, and what rules! Steak three times a day and nine hours sleep every night. It must be great to be a crew man, if it can be done.

TECHNOLOGY CLASHES WITH BROWN QUINTET

The Brown five clashed with two of the teams that the Engineer squad has met, and broke even as to wins, losing to Clark by a 27-22 score and defeating Wesleyan by two points, 27-25. Technology broke even in their two clashes with these fives but in reverse order, beating the Clark passers by 15 points and losing the Wesleyan game by the count of 23-21.

Last year's Brown game on Technology's floor was one of the best played games of the season. An extra period of five minutes was necessary to get a decision as shots by Bernie Coleman for the Engineers and Mitchell for the visitors knotted the count at 23-23 just before the final whistle. In the extra five-minute period, both Bernie and Mitchell came through again with goals and another period was necessary to decide the winner. Technology was awarded two fouls and missed both of them, but Ted Storb got the rebound of the last shot and put a pretty one right through the net, clinching the game on the spot.

The Brown lineup will have Wagenknecht, Barrett and Mitchell, who started the game for the Bruins last year, in addition to Jocelyn who went in later, Quickerman, the left guard, is a new man this season. Mitchell and Wagenknecht play the forward positions with Barrett at center.




