Technology's swimmers fitted into the middle of the final rankings in a swimming meet with the Navy and Johns Hopkins, Saturday afternoon in the Annapolis tank, scoring 12 to the middies' 40 and the Virginians' 5.

One of the best exhibitions of the meet was the showing of Captain Bill Stewart in the 100-yard breast stroke, which he won in 1 min., 23 sec. Jerry Nauman took third in this event. Second place in the relay and Azel Ames' second in the back stroke completed the Institute total.
