

Sophomores Beat Freshmen 5 to 1 Breaking Class Baseball Tie

1925's Better Hitting Nets Them
Victory Yesterday—Chilly
Day for Game

In an extra inning game the Sophs were able to break the tie and trim the freshman baseball team 5-1 yesterday. The '25 team showed a lot of improvement in their hitting and fielding. Bill Cook started for the Sophs, but had to leave in the fifth inning. Wheeler finished the game in good style and held the frosh scoreless.

The freshman team was without its regular pitcher at the start, and Wilnot started for them. At the end of the second Bates showed up and he pitched for the remainder of the game. Jacobson, the frosh catcher, was the star of the game and he made the first home run of the season which accounted for the freshmen's lone tally. He also got a two bagger, a one base hit and made first on an error in the sixth, besides stealing two bases.

The Sophs started a hitting rally in the eighth and George Balcom started it with a hit to left. The next two men fanned. Joe Terrell hit to left and Hank Lumb got a base on balls. Abe Simonds connected for a hit to center which the fielder was slow in fielding so that Simonds stretched it into a two bagger and three men came in. Fuller, the next batter, hit to center and this brought in Simonds, making the final score of 5-1.

The frosh could not get started in the eighth and although Jacobson made a neat hit the next batter struck out and the game was over. The weather was chilly which made it hard for the pitchers. Both teams played better than in previous games and the close of the season should witness some close games.

Massey started his career with the team three years ago, was out of the game for a year, and did a creditable job in the net for a few games this season, until compelled to leave by doctor's orders. The captain-elect will play in the goal next year.

Massey proved his value to the team in many instances during his first year of varsity work, one game in particular at Dartmouth indicating that he was one of the closest goal-tenders ever seen on the Hanover rink. He will have a whole squad of veterans to work with next winter, and although the loss of Captain Herb Hayden will be felt in the forward line, there is enough material left to take a flying start on.

150 POUND CREWS' FIRST RACE TODAY

Contest with Stone School Rowers to End in Front of Walker at 4:30

Racing against the Stone School eight this afternoon the first and second 150 pound crews will open the season for the Institute oarsmen. The course to be followed is the mile and five-sixteenths distance, the race starting at the boathouse at 4:30 o'clock and finishing in front of Walker.

The work of the first 150 pounders has been such that they will start with a handicap of several lengths and strive to catch the Stone shell and the second 150 pound outfit, these boats starting on even terms. Although they have put up some pretty good fights against the first boat, this second eight has found it hard to keep their pace after some distance has been covered, and today will have an opportunity to show its worth.

At 3 o'clock Thursday afternoon the first and second varsities will show their form in an exhibition race over the same course. The first outside race of the season for the Varsity comes April 28, so these preliminary races will give the men a chance to get into form, though the practices every day are about as stiff.

The busy "Wolf" is soon to have a partner in the work of coaching, for the new launch recently purchased for the use of the staff is in the water and is receiving its spring overhauling and tuning up. It is expected on the Charles by tomorrow, at least. It is a 16 mile an hour craft, and though not as fast as the "Wolf" is well able to keep up with the speediest of crews.

Eligibility Rules for Interfraternity Relay

No man on Frank Kanaly's track list, whether or not eligible for varsity competition, will be allowed to compete in the Interfraternity Relay races. Heats will be run, and for both final and preliminaries, the distance will be 110 yads per man, four men to a team. Entries must be made in the track-house office, including names of each runner, and the list will close at 10:20 o'clock on Friday morning, at which time the drawing for heats and places will be held. The finals will be the last event of the interclass meet.

The Juniors and Sophomores are also pretty well fixed for men and will grab several places before the meet is over, while the frosh have some good men who are going to place well.

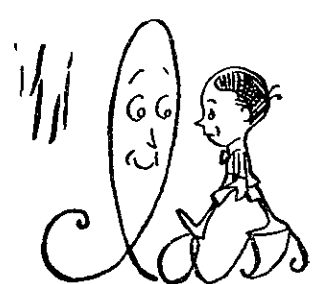
Buckler Dorm Secretary
