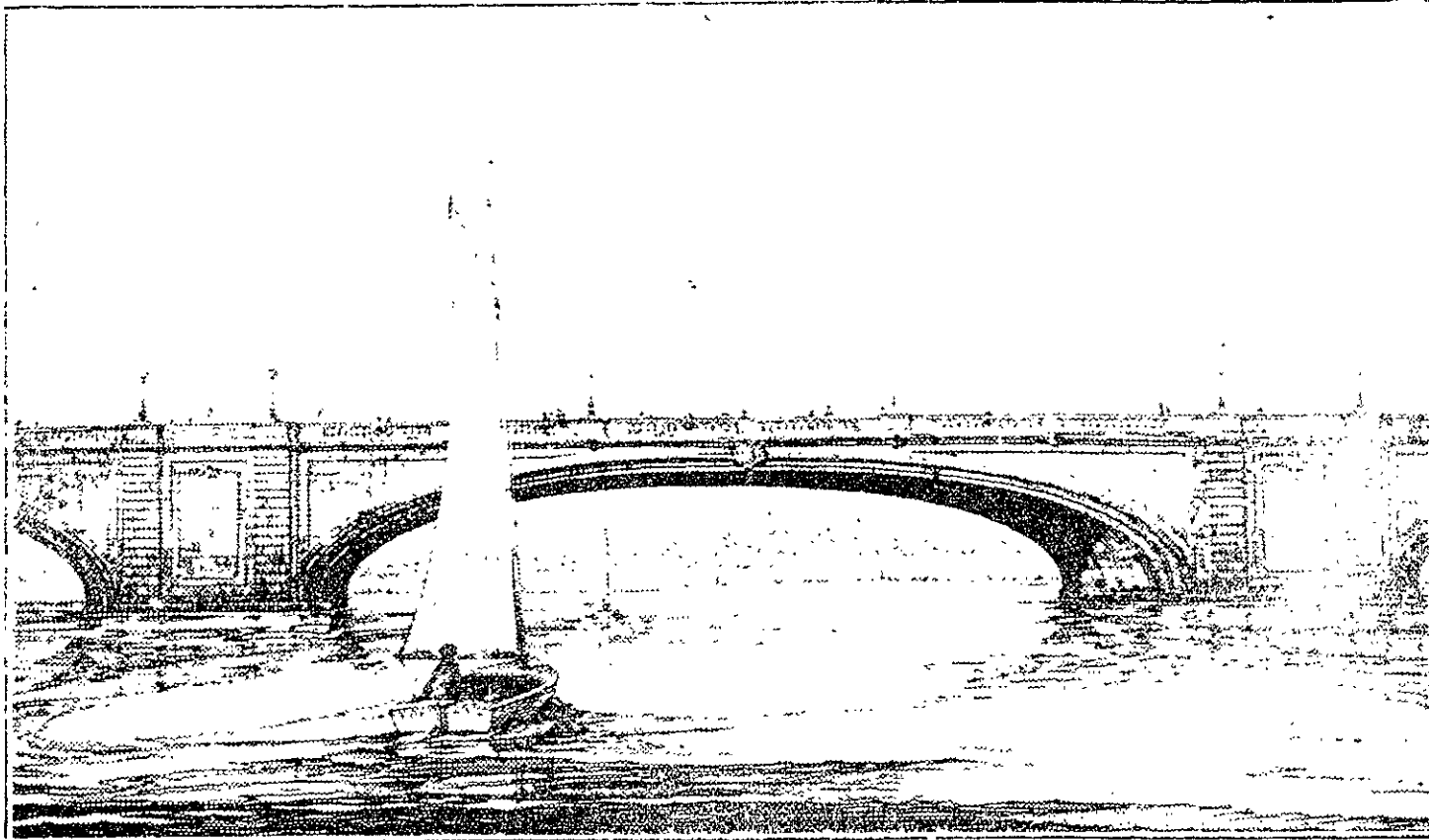




ED MOLL '24

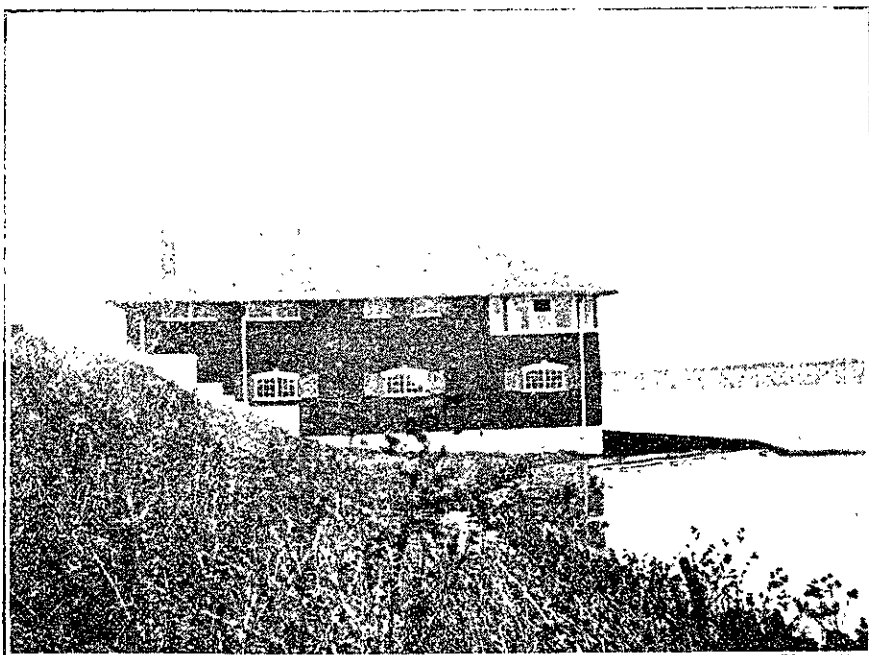
BRIDGE IN ITALIAN STYLE TO CROSS BASIN NEAR TECHNOLOGY

A sprained ankle sustained in last Saturday's game has thrown Eager out of the game for the time being.



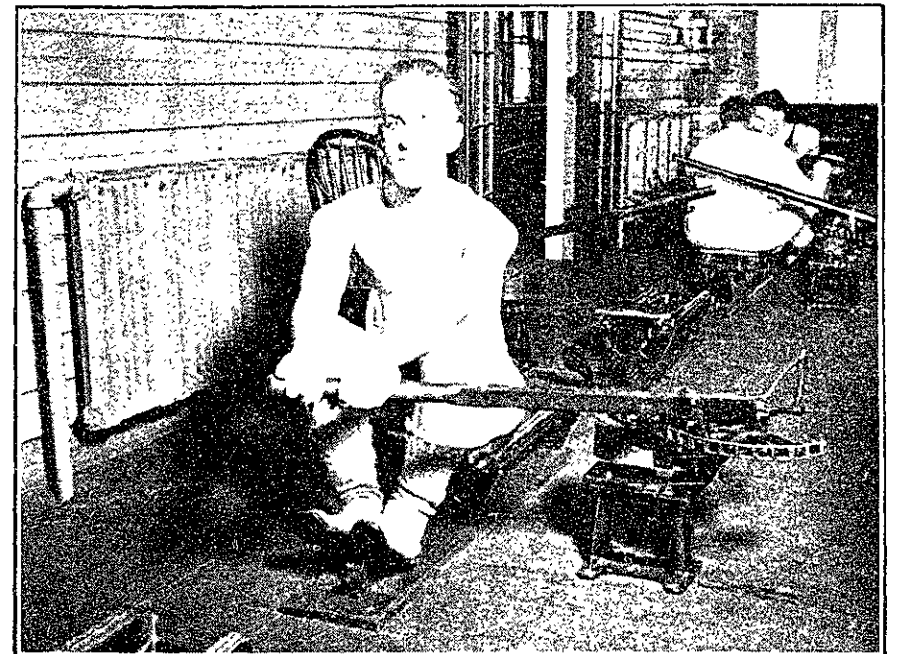
WEST VIEW OF BOAT HOUSE

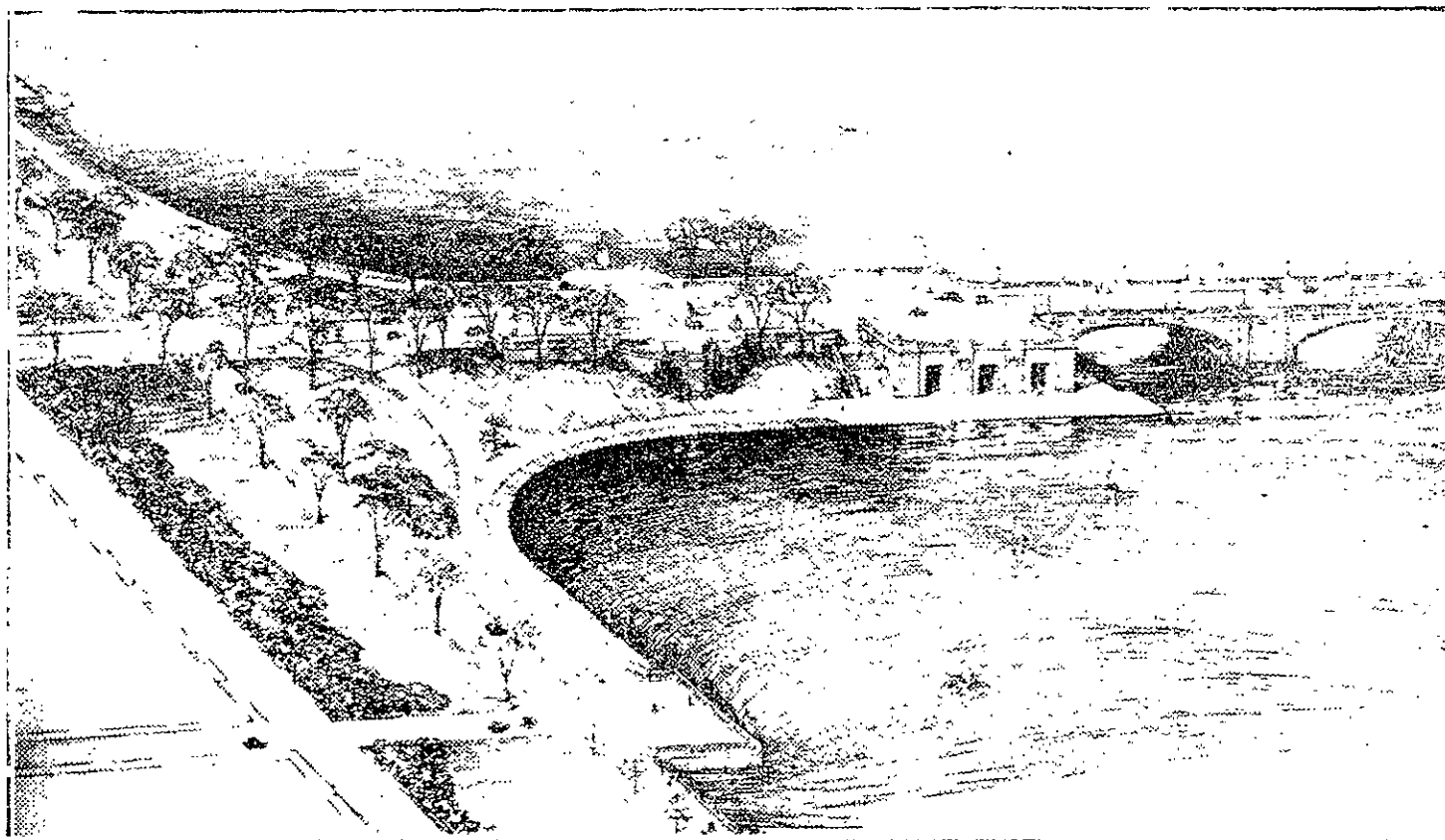
DICK EATON

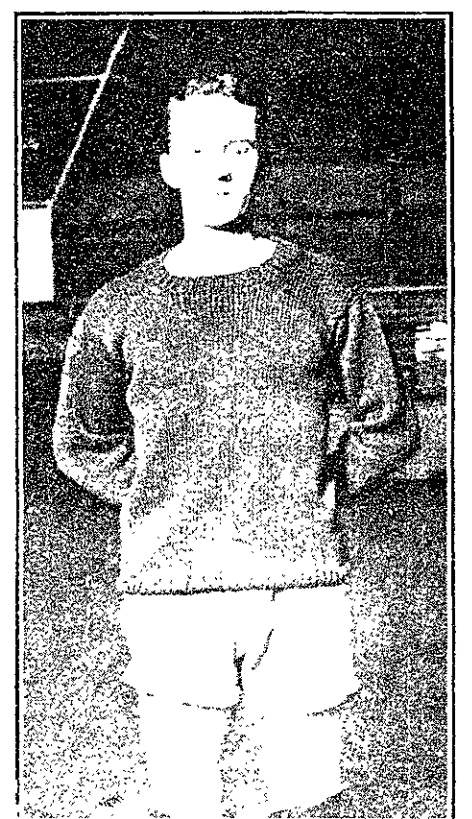
A forward whose steady playing has been a decided asset to the basketballers.
