Two Full Squads Work Out At Arena For Harvard Game

Coach Stewart Has Stressed Fundamental in Training For Coming Match

Twenty men are pulling themselves out of bed these wintry mornings to go over to the Boston Arena to learn the principles of the fastest game in the world. Coach Stewart has been putting them through the mill in preparation for the first game of the season with Harvard on December 11 at the Boston Garden. The majority of the work has been in the regular scrimmages. Each workout is started with a sort of free for all scrimmage. Coach Stewart has been getting them down to their daily drills. The past few practices he has been concentrating on his forward line.

Two Varsity Squads Practice

Of the men out for Varsity positions two complete teams have been formed to scrimmage with each other. Several veterans with a little new blood comprise one squad. Horace Ford at left wing, Penn Hall at center ice, and Hors Orbanourski at right wing make up the forward line. Captain Ben Hazeltine and Peterson are the defense men on the squad. Don Whiston ordinarily is the goal tender for this group.

The other team has a good deal of promising talent which has been giving the veteran squad plenty of trouble in the early workouts. In the line of this team are Tommy Regan at left wing, Dick Cochran at center ice, and Joe Fahey at right wing. The defense men are Ben Steveman and James Hayes. Phil Coleman guards the net for the squad.

Besides these Coach Stewart has several other promising men who should get in the games either the last of the season or an almost certain berth on next year's team. This

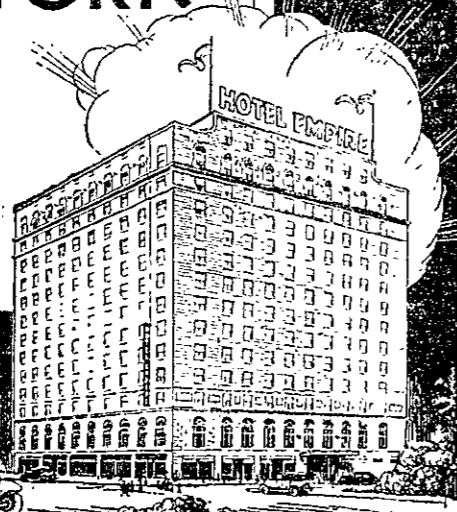
