

honor might not seem great, but it would grow with passing years, until to make the "scholarship" society or the "popularity" society would be an aim of every man who is a Tech man at the core. The following plan is advanced for the consideration of the Institute Committee:

A society shall be formed which shall be composed of the ten men foremost in their studies in the Senior Class and of the ten men foremost in the Junior Class. These men shall be chosen by the Faculty as soon as possible after the adoption of the plan. In each succeeding year ten men shall be elected from each of these classes, with the exception that if, in his Senior year, a member elected the year before still holds this pre-eminence, one less new man shall be chosen for each one so duplicating. In the future the men shall be chosen immediately on the commencement of the second term by the members still at Technology and upon the recommendation of the Faculty.

A second society shall be formed which shall be composed of the ten men from each class, excepting the Freshman Class, whom the Institute Committee shall for any reason consider are doing the most for Technology. In the future, members shall be elected by the members at Technology as follows: Immediately after each Christmas vacation five Seniors, five Juniors and five Sophomores shall be chosen for the same reasons as were the original members, under the same conditions as to duplication that would exist in the "scholarship" society; on the Monday of Junior Week five Juniors, five Sophomores and five or less Freshmen shall be elected under similar conditions.

This scheme is not presented as anything which should be followed in any of its details or as one which is in any degree complete, but merely to show what could be done if the necessary actions were taken. Something new would be given the men to strive for; something would be added and nothing subtracted from Tech life.
