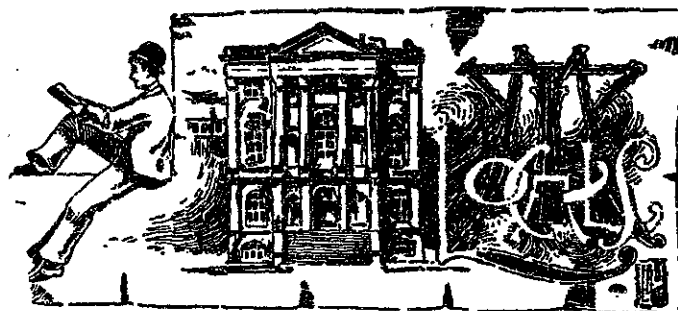
Faculty Notice.
