

Amherst Meet.

Amherst 62; Tech 64.

In the first Dual Meet ever held in Pratt Field at Amherst, the New England champions were defeated by Tech in a close and exciting contest. The result was in doubt up to the last event, the 220-yard hurdles, when Haynes of Tech overhauled W. P. Hubbard of Amherst at the last hurdle, thereby securing second place and the meet for his team.

Amherst's defeat was due to her weakness in second-string men. Ten out of fourteen firsts went to her, but the seconds and thirds were captured by Tech, and these, added to the four firsts which we obtained, were sufficient to give us the victory. The contest was clean and hard-fought throughout and the best of feeling existed between the two teams.

The individual star of the meet was Captain Taylor of Amherst, who practically won fifteen

points for his team, though five of these he lost by disqualification for fouling in the 440. Thompson, J. M. Hubbard, and Rollins each won ten points for his team, and Orrel, nine; while for Tech, Captain Curtis, Haynes, Chapman, and Farrington each won six points. Two Amherst records were broken, Rollins putting the shot 42 feet 9 inches, 6 inches beyond his previous record, and Taylor raising the high jump from 5 feet 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ inches to 5 feet 9 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches. Curtis broke his pole-vault record again, clearing the bar easily at 11 feet, while Lorenz lowered the two-mile record for the third time this season, the new record being 10 minutes 20 $\frac{3}{8}$ seconds.

The times in the dashes and hurdles were not very good, but this was due to a strong wind which blew directly against the runners. Many of the finishes were close and exciting, and as the points ran up evenly, everything combined to make the meet remarkably interesting and one which those who witnessed it will not soon forget.

100-Yard Dash—Won by Thompson, A.; Boggs, M. I. T., second; Orrel, A., third. Time, 10 $\frac{3}{8}$ seconds.
