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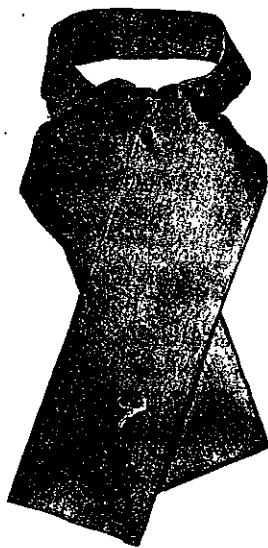

tribute to the *Institute* such suggestions or appeals as that by Mr. R. H. Smith. The discussion of the Show advocates perhaps a doubtful policy in approving the general appeal to a wider outside public made by the later librettos, at the price of subordinating or even abandoning the old, purely local fun. Undoubtedly, as suggested, the music and dance of light opera, with few or no serious acting parts, are the most effective material; but these do not preclude an indefinite amount of local appropriateness in plot, character, dialogue and songs. Nothing can serve larger purposes effectively that does not first fulfill with complete adequacy its own purely local and limited purpose. The longer editorial paragraph confuses Major with Colonel Higginson. Though the text of the comic section is really funny, the illustrations here and elsewhere in the *Institute* seem most to need strengthening. There is every reason why Tech should

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produce cartoons superior to the best work of the best college comic papers, such as the *Lampoon*. The really charming little pictures on pages 114 and 117 make too noticeable the crudity of that on page 107.
