A meeting of those interested in play-going was held Friday afternoon in 11 Rogers. There was an informal discussion of present-day plays, and a short talk by Mr. H. L. Seaver upon the English playwright, Henry Arthur Jones, author of a play now running in Boston, "Rebellious Susan." Mr. Seaver gave a short criticism of the play, praising it for its pleasing yet lasting humor.

It was agreed by those present that while no organization was at present advisable, a bulletin of current theatrical events should be kept. This will be always open for inspection in 12 Rogers, and it is hoped that not only will men use it for their own guidance, but that they will write down there comments of their own upon the plays.

All men who have not yet paid their tuition fee for the second term, have received notice from Mr. Rand that it must be paid by Friday, March 10. Men failing to do so will be excluded from Institute exercises until payment is made. The catalogue says specifically that the tuition fee must be paid *in advance* before February 20. The statement

that no bills are sent in advance for the first term is misleading, as no bills are sent for either term. No doubt much of the delay in payment of tuition is due largely to carelessness on the part of the students, but it seems that the same care should be exercised in the discharge of financial duties to the Institute as to those affecting studies.

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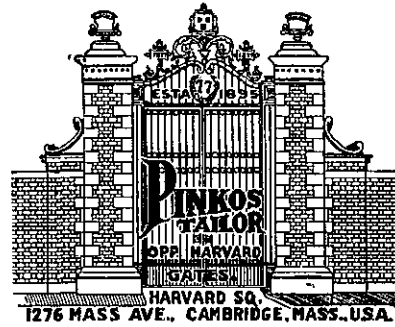
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
