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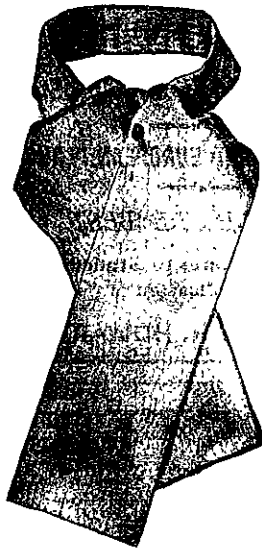


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SPRING OPENING

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COLLEGE NOTES.

"The Khan of Kathan," this year's varsity show at Columbia, was composed entirely by two undergraduates.

Pennsylvania has adopted a new method of exploiting its advantages to prospective college men. All of its large schools and sectional clubs were supplied with illustrated lectures on the university, and during Christmas vacation these were delivered before the senior classes of the high schools and academies of the state.

The Senior class at Amherst Agricultural College have refused to attend recitations until three suspended members of their class shall be reinstated. The Faculty refuse at present to reinstate these men. The offense charged is the rather juvenile amusement of throwing beans.

James Cooledrige Carter, a leading member of the New York Bar, who died lately, has bequeathed \$200,000 to Harvard University. It is stated that the gift is practically without restrictions as to the method of its expenditure.

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Yale and Princeton will meet in first dual chess match ever held between the two institutions at the Brooklyn chess club.

A new mechanical laboratory is being erected at Syracuse which will cost in the neighborhood of one hundred thousand dollars.

The intercollegiate fencing tournament will be held in the New York Athletic Club on March 24 and 25. Harvard, Yale, Pennsylvania, Columbia, Cornell, West Point and Annapolis will be represented.

The western indoor pole-vaulting record was recently made by Leroy Samse, who vaulted 11 feet 5½ inches in a dual meet between Indiana and Wabash University.

Norman Dole, '05, of Stanford University, has been notified that his pole vault of 12 feet 1.32 inches made last April, has been officially recognized as the world's record.

The Georgetown fencers won six of nine bouts from Princeton in Washington. In New York, Columbia gymnasts defeated those of Harvard, 34 to 20, and Columbia fencers defeated those of the University of Pennsylvania, seven to two.

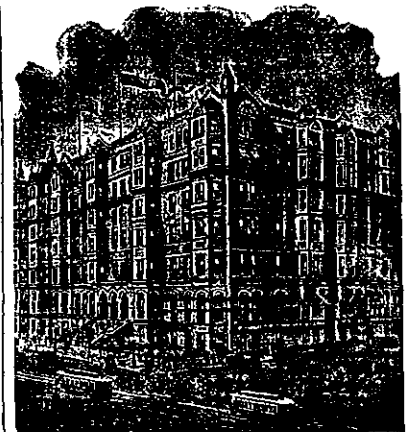
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
