Cabot Medals.

The Cabot Medals for gymnasium work have already been described in THE TECH. There are three medals awarded each year on the basis of improvement in physical development. It is especially provided that the awards are not to be made for skill, but a chance is given to the men of less ability. The object of the gift is to stimulate active, regular gymnasium work for physical development.

The examinations upon the basis of which the awards of this year are to be made will begin April 1. These examinations will have to be finished as early as possible, owing to the dismantling of the gymnasium about May 1.

COLLEGE NOTES.

Of the Yale freshmen class of three hundred and thirty-one, the report of the medical examiner shows that a hundred and forty-one smoke, a hundred and two wear glasses, and twelve have been ordered to wear them, a hundred and thirty-four have never had gymnastic training, forty-six cannot swim, and a hundred and ninety-six have been in athletics. The average weight is a hundred and thirty-six pounds.

Harvard College yard has been increased by three acres by the purchase of the Greenleaf estate on Brattle street, Cambridge.



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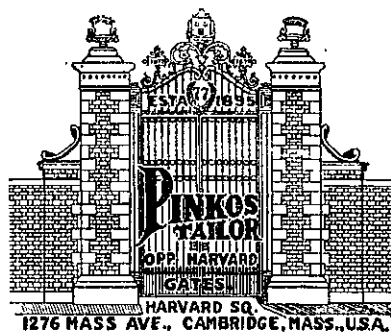


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
