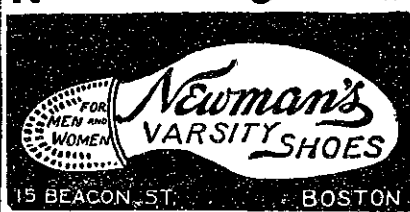

A number of amendments to the by-laws, necessitated by the recent action of the corporation in providing for a larger representation of the alumni in its membership, were adopted.

**Major Briggs Praises Tech's
Idea of Athletics.**

Major Briggs '81, in reporting for the Advisory Council on Athletics, said in part:

"It seemed to the advisory council, in 1900, that football could not be conducted on legitimate lines at the Institute; that a varsity eleven would take up too much of the men's time during the months of October and November, particularly, and further, that it was not a sport in which the athletic results were commensurate with the work and time expended for training, considering also the financial expenses involved for coaching, etc.

"The progress in college athletics throughout the country, and recent agitation to abolish football in other colleges shows that the Institute in abolishing football several years ago has been the pioneer in athletic reform, as she has been a leader in technical education."

The Committee believes that track work, tennis and golf through the whole year, and basket ball and fencing during the winter "give sufficient opportunity for the students to develop on purely healthy lines, without danger to life or limbs, and without the necessity of the undergraduate giving up practically half his time to athletic training, such as is incident to football, baseball, or rowing, and that, followed out on this plan, the individual student has a better chance to interest himself in athletic work, and at the same time get individual training and exercise."

The report of the Committee on the School brought out the increasing need for new buildings and for more apparatus in the engineering departments. The report also contained a tribute to the work of Dr. Pritchett.

ARCHITECTS ELECTED.

At the last meeting of the Architectural Society the following men were elected members: From 1907, Cummings, Harrison, Lewis, Moore, Hamill, Buckler; from 1908, Merritt, Baker, Barnes, Mohn, Brown, Wolfenden, Youngerman, Haskell; from 1906, Gideon.

Yale's crews are to have a new boathouse next year. Julian W. Curtis, the Yale rowing adviser, has had plans prepared, and the structure will be built on the shore of the Quinnipack river near the present building.
