SENIORS WIN MEET.

Sophomores Get the Relay Race in an Exciting Contest.

The Seniors walked away with the annual Class Indoor Meet Wednesday evening, getting four firsts, three seconds, one third, and four fourth places out of eight events, but losing the relay race to the Sophomores by a few inches. The final score was: '06, 35; '08, 29½; '07, 22, and '09, 11½.

There were over seventy-five persons present, excepting the contestants, but the percentage of students was so small that organized class cheering was weak. The few present, however, supported their men loyally and vociferously.

President and Mrs. Pritchett were present, and Dr. Pritchett presented the winners of first, second and third places with silver loving cups.

The high jump, the first event of the evening, was an interesting contest. Farrington, '06, easily won, while Rapelye, '08, and Very, '09, fought it out for second place, the former winning out. The snake-like jumping of Farrington created great amusement.

The 600-yard run was close and exciting. Moses, '09, led most of the way, but was passed by both Godfrey, '09, and Howe, '06, on the last lap, the former winning by a few inches.

Only three men were entered in the pole vault. Farrington, '06, won, while Orr, '08, and Very, '09, tied for second place, the former winning the jump-off for the second cup.

The 35-yard dash was an unusually exciting event, the preliminary heats failing to reveal in the least by whom the race would be won. The semi-final heats left Richards, '07, Todd, '08, Noyes, '07, and Gibbons, '06, in the final contest, the men finishing in the order named in a close race.

The 1000-yard run was Gimson's race from the start, and though closely followed by Howard, '06, he kept a steady pace, which proved to be a winning one. The other contestants held their distance well, every man running a steady race.

In the mile run, Clapp, '06, took the lead and won out by twenty yards in the fast time of five minutes and two seconds. Howland, '08, won second place by a hard sprint on the last two laps, passing several men.

The seniors won the first three places in the shot-put, the sophomores getting the other place. Polhemus won from Breitske by a narrow margin.

The 40-yard high hurdle race required three heats before being settled. 1907 had three men in the final heat and won the first three places, Farrington, '06, coming in fourth.

The relay race between 1906 and 1908 provided great excitement. Todd, '08, got the lead at the start.
