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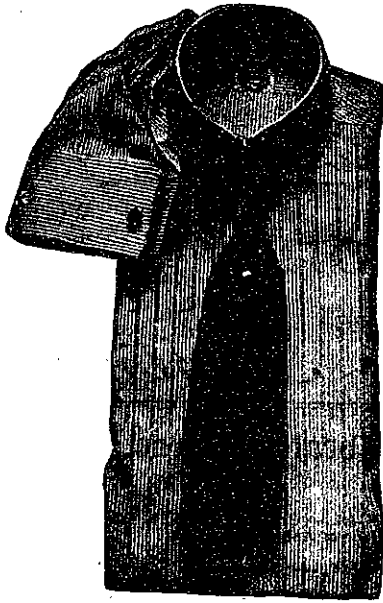

GOES ON EXPEDITION.

at the Grand Canon of Colorado, then go south to the Utah line, cross the Colorado river, turn west and south over the Kaibab Plateau, reaching the Grand Canon a second time at Point Sublime. From there the expedition will go to southern Utah to study the southern terraces of the High Plateaus, after which it will investigate the ancient volcanoes and lava cataracts of the Ninkaret Mountains, reaching the Grand Canon a third time at the mouth of the Toroweap valley. From there the course will be northward along the great Hurricane Fault to Toquerville in southwestern Utah, and along the edge of the Great Basin, where the party will study the black mountains, deserts, ancient lake terraces and fault scarps of the region.

From that point a short trip will be made eastward into the Ninta Mountains to study their stratigraphy and glacial cirques. The northward course will then be resumed through Idaho, where study will be made of the lava plateaus.
