A great part of this great success is due to Don S. Gates, the college secretary of the association at the Institute. He has put the work upon a practical business basis, has striven to make the association for everyone, and to infuse new spirit into the work. The weekly meetings have been better attended each time, and have had before them better and better speakers. Some of the future speakers will be Dr. A. A. Stockdale of the Berkeley Temple; Rev. James Alexander of the First Presbyterian; and Rev. John H. Dennison of the Central Congregational Church.

Little comment can be made upon the handbook as nearly every Tech man has one. When the book was made a strictly Tech affair, it supplied a want that had been keenly felt by all new men. This book was compiled entirely by Don S. Gates.

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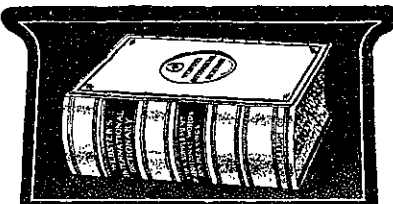
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
