

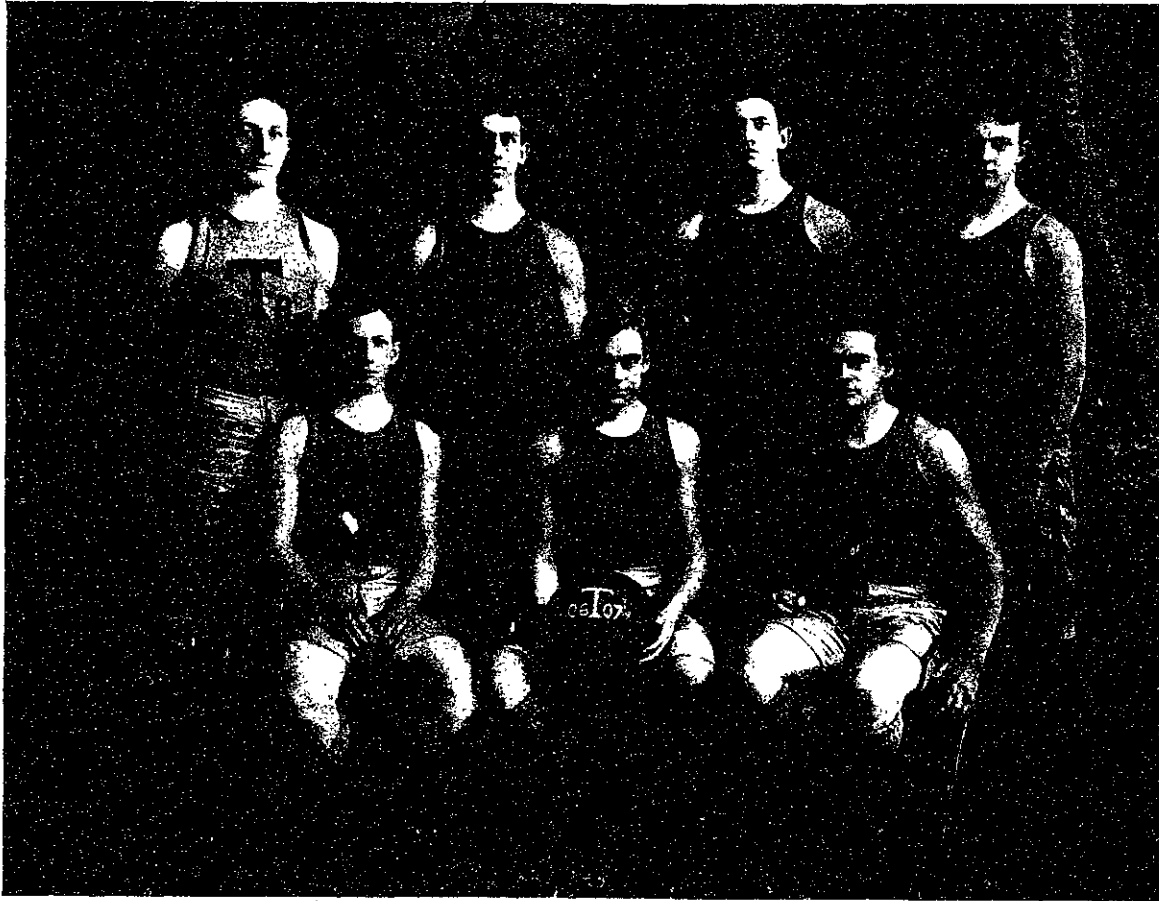

HARD SEASON FOR TEAM.

Little Opportunity for Practice and no Interest in Student Body Hurts Chances for Victories.

Owing to lack of facilities for practice, a general disinterestedness on the part of the student body and mishaps to members of the team, the basketball season of '06-'07 was not very successful.

The percentage of games won was small, but in many of the games Tech's opponents won out by only a few points. Tech scored 302 points to 392 for opponents. Out of the 17 games played only three were won.

The season opened with a large squad, but as soon as track work started, with the gym classes on the floor, there was little opportunity for basketball practice. Better arrangements have been made for next year.

Lack of interest on the part of the students affected the work of the team. Home games were attended by a very small number of Tech men. The attendance at the home games contrasted sharply with the turnouts at other colleges.
