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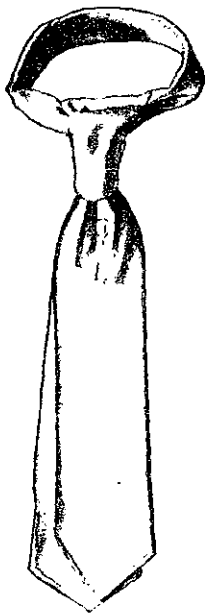
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FINAL HEAT, 220-YARD DASH

BROKE TWO RECORDS.

Stearns of Amherst, on a curved track in the remarkable time of 22 sec.; the fastest time ever made for the distance on the Worcester track. In the finals he drew ahead in the last hundred yards and defeated McCormick of Wesleyan by a good margin, in the time of 22 3-5 sec.

Herrax of Williams, was the other record-breaker, clearing the bar in the high-jump at 5 ft. 11 1-2 in., and wiping out the record established by Farrington of Tech last year. Rapelye did most remarkable work in this event, securing second place with a leap of 5 ft. 9 1-2 in. This was done without a single day of practice work during the season.

Lundell of Brown, won the mile run in 4 min. 35 1-8 sec. Tech's only place in this event was secured by Buckingham who made one of the pluckiest fights of the day, eventually placing fourth.

In the 100-yard Gram won third place, being beaten by the star sprinters, Sherman of Dartmouth and Read of Amherst. Keith of Amherst, was fourth. The time was 10 1-5.

Nisbet of . . . pleasant sur-

prise by getting third place in the discus throw, hurling the missile 105 ft. 5 in.

Orr won third place in the pole-vault at 10 ft. 6 in. The two Dartmouth stars, Bredemers and Blythe tied for first and second at 10 ft. 11 in.

The greatest interest of the day was centered in the high hurdles which were finally won by the intercollegiate record holder, Shaw of Dartmouth, defeating Hubbard of Amherst, in 15 2-5 sec. Mayhew of Brown was third and Herrax of Williams was fourth.

Tables were turned in the low hurdles, when Hubbard won out by a small margin over Shaw. Mayhew was again third and Brown of Dartmouth was fourth. The time, 25 sec., considering that the race was run on a curved track, was very good.

The track team thoroughly distinguished itself, and its plucky effort called forth general admiration.

Tech now holds three New England Intercollegiate records, being only excelled by Amherst who holds five; Bowdoin and Wesleyan each hold two, and Dartmouth Williams and Wesleyan have one apiece to their credit.

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
