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IMPORTANT THESIS IN COURSE IV.

A. H. Tashjian Doing Graduate Work
on Concrete.

In the Laboratory of Heat Measurements A. H. Tashjian is carrying on a thesis in connection with his graduate work in architecture in which he is making a study of the physical properties of concrete. The determination of the change in strength, in rate of expansion and in specific heat or portions of structures composed of concrete and steel has become the subject of great interest within the last few years and Mr. Tashjian is beginning a systematic study of these properties over wide ranges of temperature.
