Cadet Eugent A. Byrne of Buffalo, a fourth year man at the United States military academy, died in the cadet hospital at 6:35 Sunday morning as a result of injuries received in the football game between the army and Harvard Saturday afternoon.

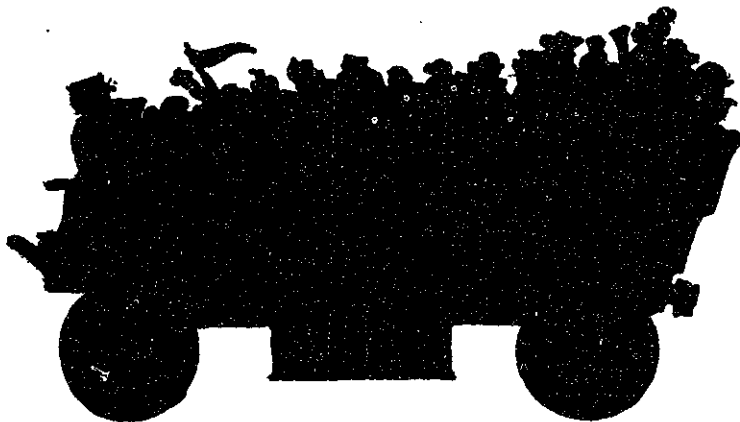
Because of the death no more football will be played by the West Point eleven this year.

The decision of the Bureau of Naturalization that Asiatics are not "Free white persons" and therefore may not become citizens of the United States, is stirring up all sorts of trouble in the diplomatic corps. This view of the Federal authorities first came to public notice through instruction sent to the clerks of the courts of Laporte and Michigan City, Ind., to the effect that they must not issue first papers to Turks. Investigation revealed that the Bureau of Naturalization had laid down the rigid rule that no Asiatic comes within the scope of the definition a "Free white person."

The Turkish Embassy has taken up the fight in behalf of those Turks who are seeking to become naturalized, and unofficial announcement is made that the Turkish Government intends to protest against the position taken by the United States.
