laboratory; he must get out into the factory and among the consumers of the goods. Not only have the processes for handling raw material to be devised, but the actual amount of such material, and of all stock on hand, must be accurately known and evaluated at all times. The Welsbach Company keeps the records of these materials in a special store-room under the supervision of one man.

The records are made on cards provided with signals of different colors which show the status of the stock. Thus if a card has a red signal (a small red spot) it means that the stock on that card is low. A white signal means "safe"; a yellow signal means "goods in transit," and so on. The cards are kept in racks much like the overland ticket racks in a railroad office. It is possible to ascertain just how the stock stands by a few minutes' investigation of these racks.
