FOREIGN.

Buenos Ayres, April 5—Argentina and Chile are at last connected by rail. The last branch connecting the railway systems of both States has been opened. Argentina was represented by the Minister of Public Works and Chile by the Minister of the Interior and the Minister of Public Works. Most cordial speeches emphasized the importance of this railway connection between the Atlantic and the Pacific oceans.

Copenhagen, April 5—Gifford Pinchot, the deposed head of the Forestry Service in the United States, will leave here on Saturday for London. He expects to meet Mr. Roosevelt in Genoa. A committee including the Speakers of both Houses of Parliament has requested Mr. Roosevelt to deliver a public lecture while here. No reply has been received to the invitation. The United Steamship Company has placed the new steamer King Hakon at the disposal of the former President during his sea travels in Northern Europe.

It is regretted that Harvard's track team cannot enjoy a trip South similar to that made by Penn this spring and by Yale a year ago. It would do the men a world of good and put them in great shape. It is also understood that no trip to Exeter will be made as a year ago. Pooch Donovan will undoubtedly keep at Cambridge during the vacation the men who will represent the crimson at the Penn relay carnival, April 30.
