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He said that at the forum at the first law meetings always took on the mob attitude, either applauding when the speaker voiced their own views on the subject, or showing disapproval when he failed to flatter their vanity by expressing contrary opinions. This inexperienced attitude, soon disappears, however, and the forum takes the address in the spirit which the warning to them at the top of their song card points out.

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He concluded by pointing out the similarity of a meeting of a board of directors to a forum meeting. The chairman of the board of directors is called upon to form the connecting link between the engineer or salesman and the directors, while the engineer or salesman must size up his audience much as a forum speaker would. At the end of his talk he answered questions from the men taking the course.

A work in two volumes, entitled "New England Aviators," containing pictures and records of all men who served in the aviation, will be issued during the holidays by Houghton Mifflin Company. The collection which was exhibited at Horticultural Hall last December has been enlarged and this latest number will contain pictures of over 500 men, giving records, citations and descriptive matter relative to their unusually brilliant exploits.

This work will be of interest to the relatives of the men and to all Technology because of the number of Institute men who served in this branch of the service.

The book will contain an introduction by President A. Lawrence Lowell of Harvard University and is dedicated to the New England aviators who gave their lives in the service. The set will sell for \$12.20, postpaid.

The new year will find Technique with most of its departments nearly complete. The Faculty section is practically ready to go to the printers. The Fraternity section is complete and the Athletic department is

"Signup Week" will come the week of January seventh to January fifteenth. During this week the student body will be asked to sign up for copies of Technique 1921. As a guarantee the students will be asked to pay one dollar down and will pay the remaining two and one-half dollars on the delivery of the book. Technique places much confidence in the support of the student body and hopes to secure at least two thousand signups.

Already over \$4,000 of advertising has been secured but so much more material is in view that the business department hopes to report close to \$5,000 by the end of the Christmas vacation. This sum will be nearly \$1,500 more than any class has ever secured before.

The election of the Sophomore and freshman Editorial Boards will take place soon after "signup week." The elections will be based largely on the showing of the candidates during the "signup week" and throughout the advertising campaign.

The Technique 1922 Electoral Board will be chosen about the end of January. This board consists of the class president and twenty-five Sophomores, who are elected at large by the Class. They will meet at least three times a week in the Technique office for periods not shorter than one hour for a discussion of important questions. At the end of a definite time it becomes the duty of the Electoral Board to choose the entire board for Technique 1922. Many men who have worked on a previous board are recommended to the board for election, but all men must be chosen by the Electoral committee and cannot hold an office by virtue of their position on the previous board.

Technique 1921 promises many novelties in their new edition. The Art Department announces that a brand new cover design, different than any ever used on a Technique before, will be the most conspicuous of the many changes they will make in the book. An original and altogether different border plate for the pages will run throughout the book. Instead of having the thick cardboard pages for section headings, which did not conform at all with the rest of the book, the divisions between the various departments will be recorded on regular paper.

The most decided change will be made in the department headed "The Classes." There will be no separate department for the Senior Portfolio but all the individual pictures of the seniors will be run under the regular class section. Instead of printing the senior pictures three on a page as was formerly the custom, they will be four on a page and may be presented in a novel panel arrangement. Besides the usual information printed beneath them, there will also be their nicknames and other new facts of interest. Instead of having the informants appear in the Portfolio, they will be grouped at the end of the section allotted to a class.

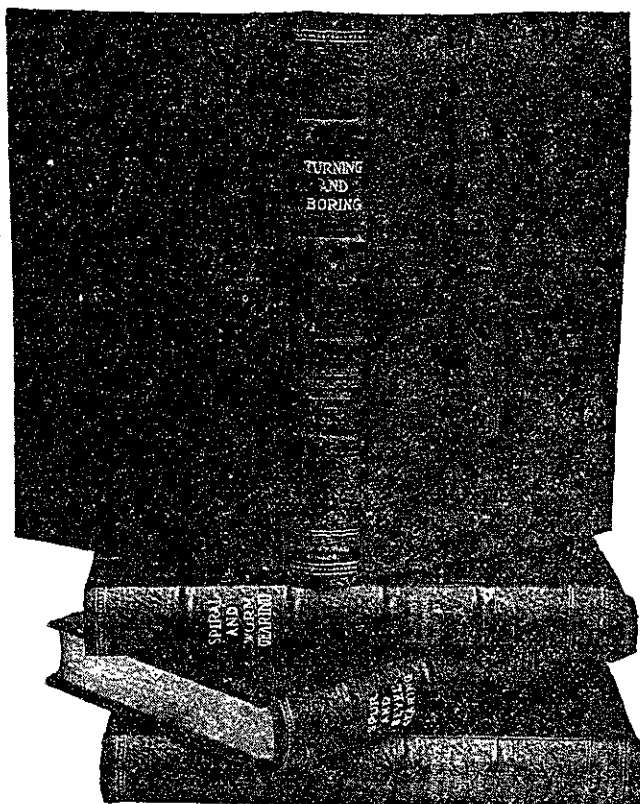
A new section will be introduced called the "War Time Class of 1918." Many of the members of the class of 1918 did not complete their courses of study at Technology, because of their enlistment in the service. By a vote of the Faculty diplomas were awarded these men, so that they are alumni of the Institute who have never had their pictures in a Technique. The section will include beside the pictures a record of the part the class played in the world war.

Technique will continue its work straight through the Christmas vacation into the new term. The most important work for the new year is the completion of the Senior Portfolio, and the board promises that any senior who does not have his picture by January seventeenth will have present a very good logical excuse order to get it in.

Technique will be put on sale, during Junior week, as is the custom. The annual Technique Rush will accompany the announcement of the entering of the yearbook to the student body, and will probably be held during the latter part of the month of April. The second post war Technique indeed looms up at present as one of the biggest and finest of yearbooks ever published at Technology.

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
