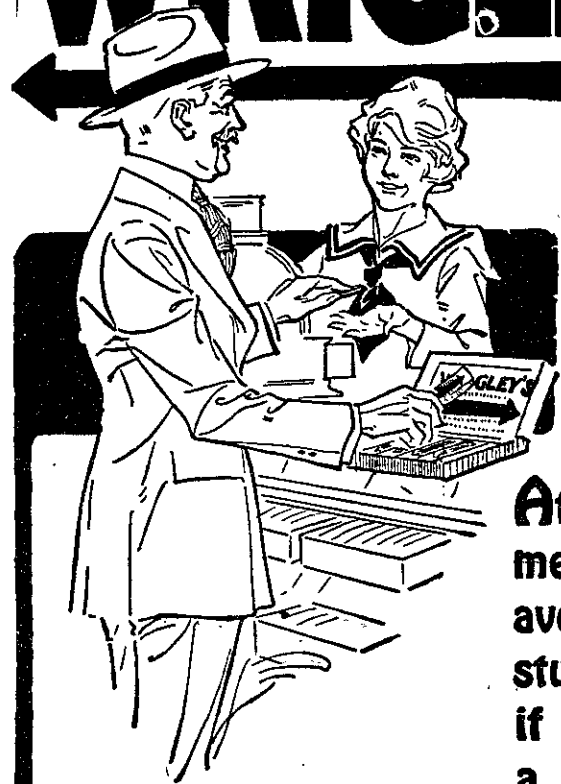

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TECH SHOW IS HOST

after the show had proved an overwhelming success that they were heard from at the Tech Show banquet, late in the school year. This time, however, the program for the evening calls for a short speech at the smoker from the man who wrote the show.

Along with the naming of the author, the show itself will be named in order that the artists may get started on a poster and program cover competition. This competition is all one in reality, the second best design for the poster being made the program cover. Last year Pierre Blouke '19 won the poster competition.

Mrs. Green Will Coach Ballet
Announcement will also be made concerning the number of men needed for the cast and chorus and information will be given concerning the nature of the parts in the cast and the time for beginning the trials. The management will also announce the number of men needed for the ballet. Miss Virginia Tanner, or more correctly Mrs. Green, will in all probability again coach the ballet. Her work with this department last year was much a pronounced success that the ballet was declared the "hit of the show" and the announcement that she will coach again will be welcomed generally. It is probable that the ballet will not number so many dancers as last year.

Coach Will Be Introduced
The coach of the show will be introduced at the smoker and will talk at length on the work of the cast and chorus. He will be well acquainted with the book and therefore fitted to discuss the prospects for a successful production.

Following the smoker, Sophomores and freshmen will get away on the stage management competition, the result of which will determine the sophomore who is to be assistant stage manager to Stuart Nixon '21 and the three freshmen who will be retained for possible assistant stage manager next year.

Details of the scenery competition will be announced by Samuel Chamberlain '20, who is in charge of this branch of the show. Chamberlain designed the scenery for the show three years ago and also wrote Walter Frazier's famous vampire song of the same year.

Further details of the music and lyrics competition will be announced. The success of the show depends in great measure on the quality of the music and lyrics turned in and great stress will be laid on this point.

In the way of entertainment for those who attend the smoker, the management has provided for lantern slides of previous shows to be thrown on the screen. In addition, Park Appel '22, who, as Marion, was leading lady of last year's "Doubtful Medium," will repeat a few of his last year's successes. The rest of the entertainment program the management refused to disclose, preferring to hold a surprise in store for Friday night.

The trials for the cast this year will precede those for the chorus, chiefly that the unsuccessful cast candidates may have a chance to get into the chorus. There will be a few extra, non-speaking parts in the show which will be given to participants in the ballet or perhaps to unsuccessful major-cast-part competitors, at the discretion of the coach.

14 Men in the Cast
The cast will number about fourteen, the management has announced. Percy Bugbee '20, general manager of Tech Show 1920 will be in charge of the smoker. He and Stuart Nixon '21, stage manager, will speak for this year's management.

The date of the Boston performances of the show is April 19, but the

theatre has not yet been secured. Last year it was given at the Hollis Street and the year before at the Boston Opera House. The performances at Smith, as usual, will precede those in Boston. There will be as in former years, a performance at a theatre in the vicinity of Boston following the April 19 shows.

The management announces that all men working in any department of the show are expected to attend the smoker.

The assistant to the general manager this year will be picked from the sophomores competing in the business department. This man is not necessarily the general manager of next year's show. His selection will be made in a month or six weeks.

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
